**Release of Animals:**

4-H & FFA rabbits will be released between the hours of 9:00 and 10:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 22. There will be no early releases. If you cannot pick your animal up, make arrangements with your 4-H leader or FFA Advisor. Any animals not picked up will be under the control of the Department Supervisor. Feed needs to be dumped from the feeders, water troughs emptied, and the cement floor cleaned before releases will be given. Ribbons and decorations may be removed starting at 8 p.m. For Cloverbuds and younger children attending school the next day, parents may clean cage area and have animals released to them.

**Enter:** All horse, small animal, and large animal educational displays can be delivered to the South Wing of the Expo Building during the Interview Evaluation time August 14 (9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) and August 15 (9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.). (This includes all FFA and out of county 4-H members not required to have an Interview Evaluation prior to fair.) All displays must be accompanied with “tie on” portion of the entry tag and should be attached visibly and securely to the back of the display and hanging below. Tags can be acquired at the Ada County Extension Office or at the Expo Building during interviews.

**1. Entry forms are turned in at the time the educational displays are brought in.** Indicate Educational Display Contest on a separate Livestock Entry Form. If entering a poster in more than one division, please use a separate Livestock Entry Form for each area. Indicate exhibitor's age, species/topic of display, class and club/chapter on entry form and back of poster. Entries will be accompanied by a numbered tie tag which should be filled out and attached securely to the back of display and hanging below at the time of entry

**2.** Horse, large animal and pygmy goat posters can be picked up at the small animal barn Thursday, August 17, after 12:00 p.m. Small animal entries will automatically be hung and are to remain on display in the Small Animal Building until the fair ends (through Open Class exhibit period).

**3.** Livestock, horse, and pygmy goats, will display educational materials at or around their animal's pens or stalls. Remember to be aware of animal's reach and keep that in mind when hanging displays and ribbons.

**4.** Check out Horse and Livestock Displays on Monday, August 21 at 10:00 p.m. and Small Animal Displays in the Expo building Monday, August 28, between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. in the 4-H area.

**Rules:**

**1.** Any 4-H or FFA member currently enrolled in a Livestock, Horse, Pygmy Goat, Small Animal or Pocket Pet project may enter.

**2.** Displays must have been made within the last year and must be the workmanship of the exhibitor(s).

**3.** Limited to two displays per completed project, but no more than six per youth.

**4.** Put member's name, club name, and age on the back of the display.

**5.** Displays will be divided into groups by age; you must have your age on the entry form.

**6.** For Livestock, Horse, and Pygmy Goat, displays can be posters, pictures, stories. Get creative. Minimum display size is 14" X 22" and maximum size is to fit exhibitor's pen/stall area.

7. Small Animal or Pocket Pet entries need to keep displays to posters only, standard size of 22" x 28" (or 20" x 30" foam core) maximum. No tri-fold posters.

8. Make displays simple to understand and have fun with it. Keep in mind that fairgoers will be looking at entries from a distance. Remember that not everyone knows what we know about animals!

**Judging:**

Complete on Thursday, August 17 by 12:00 p.m.

Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Design (40%) – color, lettering, illustration, layout  
Originality & Creativity (20%) – imagination, innovation, effort

Educational Value (40%) – single topic, informative, accuracy

**Premiums:**

\$4.00 Blue; \$3.00 Red; \$2.00 White for individual competition only.

**Ribbons:**

All displays will be judged by the Modified Danish System. Blue, Red or White for each exhibit.

**Champion and Reserve Champion Rosette** - one for Small Animal (all small animal species and pocket pets combined) and one for Large Animal (includes Horse and Pygmy Goat) for each age group.

**Rosette for Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion** – one set for each division

**Award Presentation: The Idaho Statesman and other miscellaneous awards for Large Livestock**

August 21, Monday – 5:30 p.m., Ring 1 and 2  
Between Junior and Senior 4-H Round Robin.

Large Livestock Round Robin will only be open to Ada and Canyon County 4-H or FFA members. Exception: Dairy showmen participating in the Treasure Valley Dairy Heifer Replacement Program are eligible for Round Robin.

**You are responsible to show in the round robin UNLESS you notify the supervisor otherwise. If you do not wish to participate or are not eligible because you have won before, please notify your supervisor so that they can fill the spot. If you are eligible to participate in more than one species, you must choose one species and notify your supervisors of your decision. If no notification is given, you will forfeit your awards and premiums.**

**Dress Code:**

All 4-H participants must wear a white collared shirt or blouse, clean dark pants, and closed toe and heel shoes. The exception to this will be the 4-H horse showmanship winner, who may wear their respective discipline dress, i.e. Western or English attire and 4-H dairy showmanship winner, who may wear appropriate dairy show attire.

All FFA members must be in official showmanship dress, i.e. White dress shirt, black pants, black shoes, FFA tie or scarf, and FFA jacket, dairy winner may wear official FFA dairy show attire. A decision will be made as to the jacket by the FFA supervisor based on the temperature and safety of participants.

Failure to wear appropriate dress may disqualify you from participation in round robin.

**Method of scoring:**

Sweepstakes scoring method will be used for scoring. Contestants will be scored on each species and then ranked according to score. The lowest ranking will be the winner. In case of ties: each contestant's own specie will be eliminated. If a tie still remains, an additional specie will be drawn and the winner will be based on the lowest ranking of that specie (whoever did the best). Contestants scoring will be based on knowledge questions provided to the judges by the supervisors and their showmanship abilities.

Contestants will be required to wear numbers for identification.

The animal the contestant won with must be used. Heat, safety and unforeseen conditions will constitute a substitution by the individual specie supervisor.

**Junior Round Robin Showmanship: (Large Livestock)**

August 21, Monday - 4:30 p.m., Ring 1, 2 & 3.

The Junior Champion and Reserve Champion Showman in Beef, Llama, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Sheep, Swine, and Horse will compete in this Round Robin Showmanship Contest. A Junior Champion and Junior Reserve Champion will be selected. **Previous Grand Champions of the WIF Junior Large Livestock Round Robin will be eligible to compete only in future Senior Round Robins for Champion and Reserve Champion Senior Showman.**

**Western Idaho Fair and Ada County Farm Bureau** will award a trophy to the Champion and Reserve Champion.

**Senior Round Robin Showmanship: (Large Livestock)**

August 21, Monday - 5:30 p.m., Ring 1 and 2

The Champion Showman and Reserve Champion in Beef, Dairy Cattle, Llama, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Sheep, Swine, and Horse will compete in this Round Robin Showmanship Contest. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected.

**Anyone previously winning Grand Champion at the Western Idaho Fair Invitational Super Round Robin Contest for 4-H will not be eligible to participate in the Senior Round Robin Contest.**

**Western Idaho Fair and Ada County Farm Bureau** will award a trophy to the Champion and Reserve Champion.

**FFA Round Robin Showmanship: (Large Livestock)**

August 21, Monday - 6:30 p.m.

FFA exhibitors must have completed the 9<sup>th</sup> grade to be eligible for Round Robin. FFA participants must have received a blue ribbon in Showmanship to be eligible for Round Robin.

The Champion and Reserve Champion Showman in Beef, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Swine, Sheep, Llama and Horse will compete in a Round Robin Showmanship Contest. (There must be three EXHIBITORS in each DEPARTMENT to qualify for participation in the Round Robin.) A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected.

### Senior Round Robin Showmanship: (Small Animal)

August 22, Tuesday - 11:00 a.m., Dairy Ring

4-H Supervisors from the Small Animal Departments will be responsible for selecting judges for the Senior Round Robin Showmanship Contest and notifying the Premium Office by August 1.

The Senior Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in Rabbit, Cat, Cavy, Poultry, Pygmy Goat and Dog will be eligible to advance to the Small Animal Round Robin Showmanship Contest provided that they have won a blue ribbon in showmanship. (There must be three EXHIBITORS in each DEPARTMENT to qualify for participation in the Round Robin.) A Senior Champion and Reserve Champion Showman will be selected.

**Anyone previously winning Grand Champion at the Western Idaho Fair Invitational Super Round Robin Contest 4-H or FFA in Small Animal at the WIF will not be eligible to participate.**

### FFA Round Robin Showmanship: (Small Animal)

There will be a Small Animal FFA Round Robin if there are three Small Animal Departments qualifying (to qualify there must be three exhibitors in a department). If there are no FFA Small Animal Round Robin, then FFA will compete with 4-H if they win over all Champion or Reserve Champion in their division.

If the Grand Champion showman is unable (or ineligible) to attend, the county may send the Reserve Champion showman if requirements are met.

### Enter:

County Fair (premium) offices shall contact the Western Idaho Fair Premium Office with names of eligible youth **as soon as their contests are concluded**. Participants will be mailed a one-day pass along with a one-day pass for an adult driver. Contestants should dress appropriately for 4-H or FFA.

1. The Showman will compete, showing Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Llama or Alpaca and Horse. Livestock will be provided by Open Class Exhibitors in the respective areas. The Open Class Superintendent will select two animals of each species. The animal will be fit before the contest and will not be the responsibility of the contestant. The Supervisor will be responsible for any showing equipment needed for each species during the competition.
2. Judges for each area will be the responsibility of the Super Round Robin Supervisor. Contestants will only be selected on quality of showing and presentation of each of the animals. The official 4-H Round Robin score card will be used for judging of the contest.
3. Previous 4-H or FFA Grand Champion winners of the Super Round Robin - Large Livestock are ineligible to compete.
4. The **Western Idaho Fair** will award a trophy to Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Showman for FFA and 4-H.

2. Judges for each area will be the responsibility of the 4-H Fair Supervisors for each species. The official 4-H Round Robin score card will be used for judging of the contest.
3. Ranking will be determined by points scored.
4. Previous 4-H or FFA Grand Champion winners of the Super Round Robin - Small Animal are ineligible to compete.
5. In the case of a first place tie, the tie will be determined as follows: The species that each individual qualified in will be eliminated. Names of the remaining species will be put in a hat. One name will be drawn and the highest score will determine the ranking.

The **Western Idaho Fair** will award a trophy to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Showman.

Registration: Friday, August 18, 8:30 a.m.

**4-H** - All club members from the surrounding Treasure Valley area may enter the judging contest. Counties sending teams must call the fair premium office (287-5663) by July 31 to request admission passes for members wanting to participate that are not exhibitors. Each member will judge individually. Teams of four need be designated at registration. Individual entries are still welcomed and will be grouped with other individuals to form a team. Team awards will be awarded to the designated teams set up at registration. Cloverbuds and adults are all welcome to participate but are not eligible for any of the awards. The age categories are Cloverbuds - 5-7, Junior - 8-13 and Senior - 14-18. This is the age of the individual on January 1 of the current year. The livestock contest will start at 9:00 a.m. with registration at 8:30 and will include beef, sheep and swine. The dairy contest will follow the livestock contest and will include dairy cattle and dairy goats. All Junior and Senior participants will give oral reasons on one livestock class that is announced. The reasons will be given after the dairy contest and should be under 2 minutes in length. All reasons will be scored, the reasons scores will count towards the overall score for individuals or teams. The awards ceremony for the 4-H judging contest will be Friday, August 18, 2:30 p.m. in ring 3 (sheep arena). Since this is a State qualifying contest for Ada County teams, only those giving oral reasons will be on the Ada County team going to the State 4-H Livestock Judging Contest held at the Eastern Idaho State Fair in Blackfoot on September 2-9, 2017.

**FFA** - Each FFA chapter from the Western Idaho and Boise Valley District may enter a livestock and dairy judging team with five members per team. Any individual or team who has previously won a State FFA judging contest or participated in a national contest in the respective area will not be eligible to judge for awards. FFA Judging Teams must be accompanied by their Advisor to be eligible for competition.
