SMALL ANIMAL MARKET SALE RULES

The sale will be conducted in a silent auction format. An information and bidding table will be available for potential buyers to record their bid on the exhibitor's bid sheet. Bidding will begin on Friday, August 18, at 11:00 a.m. and conclude on Sunday, August 20 at 10:00 p.m. Bidding will be done on a per pound basis. It will be up to the exhibitors to contact their successful buyers and to make the necessary arrangements.

4-H and FFA Information:

1. All market animals must be accounted for in a record book.
2. All pens must be weighed in on Thursday, August 17 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Market animals will be weighed-in by a Western Idaho Fair clerk. Each exhibitor is responsible for getting his or her market animals weighed-in at the appropriate times. Failure to do so will result in the market animals not being allowed to be sold. Animals must be dry when weighed and will be weighed only once.
3. Only 4-H'ers in Canyon and Ada Counties will be allowed to sell one (1) pen of three (3) rabbits or a pen of three (3) poultry.
4. Exhibitor will be responsible for solicitation of buyers, delivery of animals to purchaser or processor as directed by purchaser. Change of ownership is required.
5. A deduction will be made from the total amount of the sale of each animal before checks are distributed. The amount deducted, not less than \$10, will be determined by the actual costs. This money will be used for expenses such as sale operation, collection of funds, and office fees. Funds will be payable to the Ada County 4-H Leaders Association.
6. Raise bid forms will not be accepted after the close of the auction and payment must accompany the form.
7. Payment must be received by Tuesday, August 22 5 pm by delivery of check or cash to Ada County Extension office, 5880 Glenwood St, Boise or by paying through PayPal to AdaCo4-HLeaders@outlook.com
8. Payment to the consigners will be made within two months after the sale is completed.
9. No insurance will be offered.
10. Care of all market animals will be consistent with production practices and accepted standards.
11. The fair will provide feed for the small animals, but exhibitor may provide their own.

DEPARTMENT J21

Cat

Supervisor: Michele Detwiler



General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to the specific project.

Entries:

All Cat entries are due in the Premium Office by **Aug. 1** at 4:30 p.m.

All Ada County record books are due August 14-15. It is mandatory that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Call the Extension Office (287-5900) for appointment time and place.

All cats will be brought in and taken home the day of the cat show.

Rules and Regulations:

1. All cats are to be crated and leashed at all times.
2. Cats are to be clean, free of diseases, well-groomed with front and back nails clipped for ease of handling.
3. **All cats must have a photo registration and current proof of vaccination submitted with their entry.** Required vaccines are Distemper (FVRCP) 2-3 yrs., Rabies 1-3 years, & Leukemia 1-2 years. A veterinarian will check the cats at check-in.
4. All cats are to be four months of age or older.

Showmanship:

All cats exhibited must be part of the member's project and recorded in the member's record book. Showmanship will be judged on the ability of the member to handle his/her cat skillfully and to control the cat at all times. If the handler cannot control the cat or if the cat becomes agitated or stressed, the cat will be removed from the ring. General health, cleanliness and grooming of the cat will be judged. Member's knowledge of basic cat anatomy, health, breed, and care will be judged. Cats must be shown in proper handling equipment which is a properly fitted harness and leash. Members should be neat and clean, and dressed appropriately for showmanship. The recommendation for proper 4-H showmanship attire is a white long sleeve shirt/blouse, dark pants or skirt, and no open-toed shoes.

Costume:

Each participant will be allowed one exhibit per species from those exhibited at the fair. More than one animal may be used per exhibit from their own project. Cats need to be in harness. If they become unmanageable, they will have to return to their crate.

Exhibitors of cats must obtain a release from Department Supervisor.

- 2101.** FFA will be grouped with Intermediate or Senior 4-H classes unless 3 or more are participating.
- 2102.** Senior - 4-H members 14-18 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year.
- 2103.** Intermediate - 4-H members 11-13 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year.
- 2104.** Novice II - 4-H members 11-18 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year, with NO previous show ring experience with any species.
- 2105.** Junior - 4-H members 8-10 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year
- 2106.** Novice I - 4-H members 8-10 years of age, with no previous show ring experience with any species.
- 2107.** Cloverbud - 4-H members who are 5-7 years old by January 1 of the current 4-H year. Cloverbuds are allowed to ONLY show small animals as long as the project animal does not exceed the weight of the exhibitor. Cloverbuds are not allowed to exhibit large livestock. Cloverbuds exhibit for participation ribbons only.
- 2108.** Costume Contest

Ribbons:

Awards will be made on merit as determined by the judge considering condition and showmanship skills of the exhibitor. All exhibitors will be judged by the

Modified Danish System. Blue, Red or White flat ribbons will be awarded to each exhibitor. Blue flat ribbon exhibitors ranked 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each class will receive a Blue, Red, and White Rosette respectively. Rosettes will be awarded to the Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in both the Junior and Senior Divisions.

The Senior and Junior Champion Showman will be eligible to participate in the Small Animal Round Robin if there are 3 or more participants in these divisions. These Champions will be required to show a rabbit, poultry, dog, cat, cavy and pygmy goat. Winner of the Small Animal Round Robin is determined by his or her ability to show all types of animals.

General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock – 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to this specific project. No person shall handle any cavy, other than their own, without permission of the division supervisor. **All cavy entries are due in the Premium Office by August 1 by 4:30 pm.** All Ada County 4-H record books are due August 14-15. IT IS MANDATORY that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Call the Extension Office (287-5900) for appointment time and place.

All cavies must be permanently earmarked. Breed and variety of cavy, ear tag or tattoo number, birth date, and sex of the cavy should be indicated on entry form.

Building Hours: 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Rules and Regulations:

All cavies must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All cavies will be checked by a veterinarian at the Fairgrounds. Unsightly or unthrifty specimens are not acceptable and will be removed at the discretion of the Division Supervisor and/or the Junior Division Superintendent. Exhibitors need to provide their own cable ties to secure cage doors if desired. If questions arise, the decision of the Open Class Superintendent will prevail.

Showmanship:

All cavies exhibited must be part of the member's project and recorded in the member's record book. All cavies used for showmanship must be exhibited at the fair and owned by the member. Cavy Showmanship will be according to the 4-H Cavy Showmanship standards. Information on these standards can be obtained from the Ada County Extension Office in the Washington State Manual. Showmanship classes for cavies will be the same as for other livestock. Entries must be made on an entry blank and include birth date of member.

Judging:

Purebred classes will be judged by ARBA standards. A cavy that does not meet purebred restrictions will be entered into the appropriate PET class. Each breed will show separately. They will be judged first by variety then for Best of Breed. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their cavies to the judging table at the appropriate time. Ribbons will be awarded in all classes. No exhibitor may receive more than a combination of 20 premiums in the cavy division, but may exhibit more animals, if space allows. The division supervisor will interpret the rules and any items not covered by the rules. The decisions of the division supervisor and/or co-superintendents will be final. **(No exhibitor shall be eligible for more than 2 premiums in any one class)**

Premiums:

Quality - \$4.00 Blue; \$3.00 Red; \$2.00 White

Showmanship - \$5.00, \$4.00, \$3.00 (1st Blue, 2nd Red, 3rd White Rosettes respectively) for the top 3 in FFA and each 4-H division.

Cloverbuds - Participation ribbon only. No premium will be paid.

Ribbons:

Awards will be made on merit as determined by the judge, considering type, condition and showmanship. All exhibits will be judged by the modified Danish System.

Showmanship – Blue, Red or White for each exhibit. Blue ribbon exhibitors ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class will receive a Blue, Red or White Rosette respectively.

Quality – Blue, Red or White for each exhibit.

Rosettes awarded for:

Best In Show
Reserve of Show
Best of Breed
Best Opposite Sex of Breed

Costume:

Each participant will be allowed one exhibit per species from those exhibited at the fair from their own project. More than one animal may be used per exhibit from their own project. (Youth may sign up at shows or where posted.)

Races:

Each participant will be allowed one heat with one entry from those exhibited at the fair. Each animal will be allowed one minute to complete the heat. Each species will run in their own specially made track. Races follow the rabbit, cavy and poultry costume contests, not necessarily in that order.

2206. Novice I- 4-H members 8-10 years of age, with NO previous show ring experience with any species.

2207. Cloverbud - 4-H members who are 5-7 years old by January 1 of the current 4-H year. Cloverbuds are allowed to ONLY show small animals as long as the project animal does not exceed the weight of the exhibitor. Cloverbuds are not allowed to exhibit large livestock. Cloverbuds exhibit for participation ribbons only.

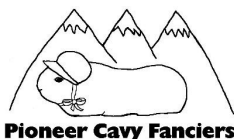

Herdsmanship:

All 4-H and FFA exhibitors will be responsible for the cleaning of their own cavy pens, as well as for feeding and watering their own animals. This is to be done daily by 10:00 a.m. Pen shavings are to be changed daily. We suggest you bring your own water bottles, but watering cans will be available. Feed will be provided for your animals. Each club is responsible for watching over their animals and keeping the floors tidy during each day the animals are exhibited. Each club will act as host and hostesses in the Small Animal Building during the fair. All clubs are to sign up for shifts according to the number of animals involved at the fair.

Release of Animals:

4-H & FFA cavies will be released between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 22. All animals must be removed by 10:00 p.m. There will be no early releases. Ribbons and decorations may be removed starting at 8 p.m. If you cannot pick up your animal, please make arrangements with your 4-H or FFA leader. Any animal that is not picked up will be under the control of the Department Supervisor. A

release will be granted when your area is cleaned. This includes the dumping of feed, water, cleaning and disinfecting of cups and trays.

DEPARTMENT J23

Dog

Supervisors: Tony & Theresa Houston



General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock – 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to the specific project.

Exhibitors will keep their dogs under control at all times. **OWNER ASSUMES FULL LIABILITY FOR ANY ACTION OF THEIR DOG(S).** The judge will remove from competition any dog that cannot be controlled by its handler or acts aggressively towards persons or dogs. Any handler who interferes willfully with another competitor or dog; and/or any handler who uses excessive force or rough correction with his/her dog will be removed. Exclusion or expulsion is at the discretion of the judge, Dog Supervisor or their designated person. If a dog or handler is expelled or excused by a judge, the reason shall be stated in the judge's report.

ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.

Entries:

All dogs must have a photo registration and current proof of vaccination, submitted to the Premium Office WITH the entry form. All dogs entering the fairgrounds and participating in the 4H program must have proof of current vaccines for DHPP (Distemper, Hepatitis, Parainfluenza, Parvovirus), Rabies, and Bordetella (kennel cough), as documented by a licensed veterinarian. Current vaccines means that the time period for which the licensed

veterinarian has validated the vaccines for, hasn't expired. Bordatella must be given within six months of the Fair. If for some reason your dog can not have a particular vaccine, it will be necessary to have a signed note from your veterinarian, stating why the vaccine cannot be given.

All dog entries are due in the Premium Office by August 1 by 4:30 p.m. and Ada County record books are due by August 14-15. **No late or incomplete entries or entries without current proof of vaccinations will be allowed to show.** IT IS MANDATORY that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Call the Extension Office for appointment time and place.

All dogs will be checked by a Veterinarian at check-in. NO DOG WILL BE PERMITTED TO SHOW WITHOUT THE VET CHECK. No dogs 6 months old or under will be allowed to show. No bitches in season will be allowed to show.

Rules and Regulations:

1. All exhibitors' dogs must comply with the health requirements and other regulations under the Ada County Dog Project.
2. Dogs that are not registered on an entry form and have not submitted a photo registration with current vaccination record to the Ada County Extension office will not be allowed on the show grounds. (Exception – If an exhibitor's dog is unable to participate due to illness, injury or being in season, a replacement dog may be used with a current signed health certificate. These exhibitors may not compete for rosettes or trophies.)
3. No dog will be permitted to show if they have been in an unprovoked dogfight 30 days prior to fair time.
4. Exhibitors are not permitted to show two dogs in one class. (An exhibitor can show more than one dog if they are registered in two different classes. i.e. showmanship and obedience, pre-novice and open, etc).
5. Dogs are to be crated or leashed at all times, and are to be kept in exhibit area.
6. **NO DOG IS TO BE LEFT UNATTENDED.**
7. **NO TREATS, TOYS or BAIT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SHOW OR OBEDIENCE RING.**
8. Champion and Reserve Champion showmanship winners will be eligible to compete in the Small Animal Round Robin. Anyone previously winning a Small Animal Super Round Robin at the Western Idaho Fair may not be eligible to participate. (see under Round Robin Showmanship)

Premiums: (No exhibitor shall be eligible for more than 2 premiums in any one class)

Showmanship – \$4.00 Blue, \$3.00 Red, or \$2.00 White flat ribbons will be grouped and awarded to each exhibitor.

Obedience – Flat ribbons will be awarded to each exhibitor. Dogs will be placed in Blue, Red, and White award groups at the Judge's discretion. A minimum score of 170 is required for a Blue award, 120-169 for a Red award, 119 or less for a White award.

In addition to the prior, a 1st Blue Rosette \$5.00, 2nd Red Rosette \$4.00, 3rd White Rosette \$3.00 will be given respectively for the top 3 blue ribbon exhibitors in each Obedience class. **Cloverbuds** – Participation Ribbon only, no premium will be paid.

A Rosette will be awarded to the Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in both Junior and Senior Divisions. A Rosette will be awarded to the Champion Obedience Dog and Reserve Obedience Dog.

Showmanship Classes:

Showmanship will be judged based on the criteria as outlined in the Canine Connection Dog 2 book page 31 and the Dog Resource Handbook (4-H 201R). In summary, the exhibitor will be judged on the ability of the member to handle his/her dog skillfully and to control the dog at all times while in the show ring. General health, cleanliness and grooming of the dog will be judged. Exhibitor's knowledge of basic dog anatomy, health, and care will be judged. Dogs must be shown in proper handling equipment; show collars and show leads. Members should be dressed appropriately for showmanship and be neat and clean. No open toe or heel shoes will be permitted. No treats, toys or bait will be allowed in the show ring.

Obedience Classes:

Obedience will be judged based on the criteria as outlined in the Dog Helper's Guide Book 18-32 and the Dog Resource Handbook (4-H 201R). In summary, obedience will be judged on the ability of the exhibitor to have their dog perform a series of exercises for each class as described in the above book. The judge will award points based on the exhibitor's ability to complete each exercise. All obedience dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or training collar. The collar is defined as either a flat collar or a slip collar of either chain or fabric with one ring at each end. All members competing in obedience must use a 6 foot leather or fabric lead. If you received a blue ribbon in your obedience class at last year's fair, you must proceed to the next level of obedience. (Exception: If an exhibitor has

a new dog, they may be allowed to repeat levels at the discretion of the supervisor.) No treats, toys or bait will be allowed in the obedience ring.

Costume:

Each participant will be allowed one exhibit per species from those exhibited at the fair from their own project. More than one animal may be used per exhibit from their own project. (Youth may sign up at shows or where it is posted.) Dogs can enter the fairgrounds starting at 5:00 pm. Exhibitors of dogs and cats must obtain a release from Department Supervisor.

Dog Judging Contest

The dog judging contest will allow exhibitors to test their knowledge about dogs and dog care. Topics include 4-H Dog showmanship, canine health, anatomy, training equipment, breeds and groups. Use the curriculum guides as a resource. In addition, a study guide will be available for pick up on July 1 at the Extension Office or at the Premium Office. The dog judging contest will take place the day of the dog show between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. All Dog Judging Contest entries must be completed by 12:00 p.m. No Premiums will be paid for Dog Judging Contest.

Dog Showmanship

You must enter showmanship to be eligible for premiums. The following classes are open to Ada and Canyon County 4-H and FFA members ONLY.

2312. Cloverbud All exercises performed on leash. Heel, forward, right, left and about turns, automatic sits, figure 8, sit for examination, recall, long sit (1 minute)

2313. Pre-Novice A (for first year members with first year in dogs) This class may not be repeated.

All exercises are performed on leash. Heel; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight; stand for examination; recall, group exercises of long sit (1 minute), and long down (3 minutes).

2314. Pre-Novice B (for experienced members or members with experienced dogs)

All exercises are performed on leash. Heel; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight; stand for examination; recall, group exercises of long sit (1 minute), long down (3 minutes).

2315. Novice

Heel on and off lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight; stand for examination; recall, group exercises of long sit (1 minute), long down (3 minutes)

2316. Graduate Novice

Heel on lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight off lead; drop on recall; dumbbell recall; recall over high jump; recall over broad jump; group exercises long down (3 minutes with handler out of sight).

2317. Open

Heel off lead; right, left and about turns; automatic sits; figure eight off lead; drop on recall; retrieve on flat; retrieve over high jump; broad jump; group exercises of long sit (3 minutes with handler out of sight), long down (5 minutes with handler out of sight).

2318. Graduate Open Class

Signal exercise; scent discrimination; directed retrieve; moving stand and examination; go out; directed jumping.

2319. Utility

Signal exercises; scent discrimination (Article 1 and 2); directed retrieve; directed jump; moving and stand for examination.

Note: Classes may be divided at the discretion of the Dog Supervisors.

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock – 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to the specific project. Poster Contest Entries: Please read the sections covering this entry.

All entries are due in the **Premium Office** by **August 1** at 4:30 p.m. All Ada County record books are due August 14-15. It is mandatory that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Call the Extension Office for an appointment time and place.

Rules and Regulations:

1. All pocket pets must be secured in a cage or proper container.
2. Pocket pets must be kept in cage until their class is ready.
3. No poisonous or venomous pocket pets will be permitted.
4. Pocket pets are to be clean and free of diseases.
5. All pocket pets will be brought in and taken home the day of the show.

Enter: Friday, August 18

7:00 p.m. – Check-in (Small Animal Building) with Showmanship immediately following

Showmanship:

All pocket pets exhibited must be part of the member's project and recorded in the member's record book. Showmanship will be judged on the ability of the member to handle his/her pet skillfully and to control the pet at all times. General health and cleanliness will be judged. Member's knowledge of basic anatomy, health and care will be judged. Members should be dressed appropriately for showmanship and be neat and clean. The recommendation for proper 4-H showmanship attire is a white, long sleeve shirt/blouse, dark pants/skirt and no open-toe shoes.

1. Showmanship - Entry Required

2401. FFA will be grouped with Intermediate or Senior 4-H classes unless 3 or more are participating.

2402. Senior - 4-H members 14-18 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year.

2403. Intermediate - 4-H members 11-13 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year.

2404. Novice II - 4-H members 11-18 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year, with NO previous show ring experience with any species.

2405. Junior - 4-H members 8-10 years of age as of January 1, current 4-H year

2406. Novice I - 4-H members 8-10 years of age, with NO previous show ring experience with any species.

2407. Cloverbud - 4-H members who are 5-7 years old by January 1 of the current 4-H year. Cloverbuds are allowed to ONLY show small animals as long as the project animal does not exceed the weight of the exhibitor. Cloverbuds are not allowed to exhibit large livestock. Cloverbuds exhibit for participation ribbons only.

Ribbons:

Awards will be made on merit as determined by the judge considering condition and showmanship skills of the exhibitor. All exhibitors will be judged by the Danish System. Blue, Red or White flat ribbons will be awarded to each exhibitor. Rosettes will be awarded to the Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in both the Junior and Senior Divisions. Pocket Pet showmen will not be eligible to participate in the Small Animal Round Robin.

General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock – 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to this specific project.

All poultry entries, which include chickens, ducks, geese, pigeons, turkeys and other domestic fowl, are due in the Premium Office by August 1, by 4:30 p.m. All Ada County 4-H record books are due August 14 - 15. IT IS MANDATORY that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Call the Extension Office (287-5900) for appointment time and place.

Rules and Regulations:

POULTRY

Poultry must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-of-state poultry must meet Idaho import requirements. All out-of-state poultry must be accompanied by a Health Certificate from a veterinarian. All poultry are subject to inspection and testing at the Fairgrounds during check-in. Poultry should originate from

flocks which are members of the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP). If tested, poultry **are required** to be negative for **Salmonella pullorum-typhoid**. Poultry may not enter the building until they have been tested and inspected.

PIGEONS AND DOVES

Pigeons and Doves must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. It is recommended that all pigeons be vaccinated for PMV and paratyphoid. All out-of-state pigeons must be accompanied by a Health Certificate from a veterinarian. All pigeons and doves are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

All birds' health will be checked before entering the building. Birds suffering from disease or external parasites at check in will be refused entry by the Supervisor or Assistant Supervisor.

Birds will not be accepted without a numbered leg band. The number must be listed on the entry form. All pigeons must be banded with a seamless band of reputable banding organizations. If split bands are used, pigeons will be classed as old birds.

Newly purchased birds or eggs may not be shown. Birds must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for at least 90 days, must be a 4-H project and must be in the exhibitor's record book.

Breed, variety, division, class, band number, birth date and sex of the birds entered in the poultry division must be included on the fair entry form. Only birds listed on the fair entry form will be allowed in the building. Any entry form not filled out correctly and signed will be sent back.

No person other than the owner shall handle any of the poultry exhibited without permission of the Supervisor.

Exhibitors need to provide their own cable ties to secure cage doors if desired. If questions arise, the decision of the Supervisor and/or Open Class Superintendent will prevail.

Judging:

All exhibitors must participate in Showmanship. Exhibitors must also be present while birds are being judged for quality. During quality, the birds will be judged according to the American Poultry Association, the American Bantam Association or the American Pigeon Association standards. The only exceptions are:

1. The Crossbred class which, if they are without any other disqualifications, will be judged on condition and cleanliness only.
2. The Meat and Egg Laying classes will be judged by market considerations.

Premiums:

Quality - \$4.00 Blue; \$3.00 Red; \$2.00 White

Showmanship - \$5.00, \$4.00, \$3.00 (1st Blue, 2nd Red, 3rd White Rosettes respectively) for the top 3 in FFA and each 4-H division.

Cloverbuds - Participation ribbon only. No premium will be paid.

No exhibitor shall receive more than 20 premiums in the poultry division.

Ribbons:

Awards will be made on merit as determined by the judge, considering type, condition and showmanship.

All exhibits will be judged by the modified Danish System. Showmanship – Blue, Red or White for each exhibit. Blue ribbon exhibitors ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class will receive a Blue, Red or White Rosette respectively.

Quality – Blue, Red or White for each exhibit Rosettes for Best of Breed, Best Reserve in Breed, Best in Show, Best Reserve in Show – no premiums will be paid for rosettes.

Contest Descriptions:

Eggstravaganza Egg Decorating Contest:

Decorate an egg or eggs! Must be one project. Use chicken, duck or goose eggs, your own creativity and any materials. Special consideration will be given to eggs displaying the fair theme 'Stars, Stripes and Fair Delights'.

Contest is open to any 4-H or FFA member – 1 entry per exhibitor. Sign up and turn in entries on Thursday, August 17 from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the Small Animal Building. Entries can be picked up on Tuesday, August 22 between 9:00 and 10:00 p.m.

Special prizes will be awarded – no premiums will be given for this contest.

Costume:

Each participant will be allowed one exhibit per species from those exhibited at the fair from their own project. More than one animal may be used per exhibit from their own project. (Youth may sign up at shows or where it is posted).

Races:

Each participant will be allowed one heat with one entry from those exhibited at the fair. Each animal will be allowed one minute to complete the heat. Each species will run in their own specially made track. Races follow all costume contests.

Breed of the Day Activities:

Make a small poster (11" x 14") describing one poultry breed you have entered in the fair. The poster might include special traits of the breed, strong points, disqualifications, and why you chose that particular breed.

Contest is open to any 4-H or FFA member entered in the Poultry Division. Breed must be a 4-H project and entered in the fair. Sign up and turn in entries on Thursday, August 17 from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the Small Animal Building. Entries will be placed in a drawing, and every morning, from Friday through Tuesday, a new Breed of the Day will be drawn. Special prizes will be awarded – no premiums will be given for this activity.

Crowing Contest:

How well can you imitate a rooster? Sign up for the Crowing Contest to be held on Saturday, August 19 immediately after the Eggstravaganza Award Ceremony. Natural ability only-no mechanical aids allowed!

Open to any 4-H or FFA member. Special prizes will be awarded-no premiums will be given for this contest.

Herdsmanship:

All Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning their pens daily. All cage areas must be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. Each exhibitor will be responsible for feeding and watering their own animals. 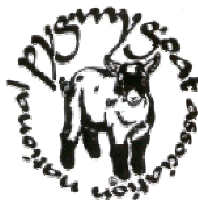

(This includes all FFA and out of county 4-H members not required to have an Interview Evaluation prior to fair.) All displays must be accompanied with “tie on” portion of the entry tag and should be attached visibly and securely to the back of the display and hanging below. Tags can be acquired at the Ada County Extension Office or at the Expo Building during interviews.

1. Entry forms are turned in at the time the educational displays are brought in. Indicate Educational Display Contest on a separate Livestock Entry Form. If entering a poster in more than one division, please use a separate Livestock Entry Form for each area. Indicate exhibitor's age, species/topic of display, class and club/chapter on entry form and back of poster. Entries will be accompanied by a numbered tie tag which should be filled out and attached securely to the back of display and hanging below at the time of entry

2. Horse, large animal and pygmy goat posters can be picked up at the small animal barn Thursday, August 17, after 12:00 p.m. Small animal entries will automatically be hung and are to remain on display in the Small Animal Building until the fair ends (through Open Class exhibit period).

3. Livestock, horse, and pygmy goats, will display educational materials at or around their animal's pens or stalls. Remember to be aware of animal's reach and keep that in mind when hanging displays and ribbons.

4. Check out Horse and Livestock Displays on Monday, August 21 at 10:00 p.m. and Small Animal Displays in the Expo building Monday, August 28, between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. in the 4-H area.
