ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 4. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **Any late entries are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 8.** Payment must be made with entry. Only Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

- The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. **Ringside Entries are prohibited. To change or add classes for animals already entered, exhibitor must notify the Premium Office by the evening before the show.** Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and breed of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of all stallions and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam of all stallions entered.
Draft Horse in all cases refers to the Draft Horse Breeds as listed in Divisions 1 through 6.
Draft Horses are divided into two sections: A – Divisions 1 – 5 (Shire, Percheron, Belgian, Clydesdale and Suffolk) and B – Division 6 (Other Draft Breeds).
Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class. No team or single horse will be allowed to compete more than once in any one class.**
 - FEES:** An entry fee of \$10.00 per head will be charged. (\$20.00 per head if late.) Entry fee for all Hitches, Log Pulling, Gambler's Choice and Riding Classes is \$3 per class. **No refund on entry fees.**
 - PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. Additional passes may be purchased for \$5.00 per day as needed for drivers, handlers, etc., listed on entry form. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
 - PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. For more information see General Rules and information on page 4 or Website under General Rules. **Storage pods** will be available in the designated area south of the trackside arena to store tack, feed, equipment, etc.
- Because of limited space, livestock and horse trailers can not be parked inside of the Fairgrounds.
 - CAMPING:** See General Rules and information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
 - ARRIVAL:** Draft horses may arrive after 6:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 23 and **must** be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. that day. Please contact the Superintendent for special arrangements for late arrivals.
 - STALLS:** Stalls are available in the Draft Horse Barn at no cost to the Exhibitor. **The number of stalls required must be reserved at the time entries are submitted.** If space for tack and harness is needed, this too should be reserved. Anyone interested in dressing up their tack and harness space with displays, trophies, banners, etc. is encouraged to do so as it is of great interest to the public.
 - JUDGING SCHEDULE:** All events are to be held in the Onion Ring (Trackside Arena).
Thursday, Aug. 24 – 2:00 p.m.: Halter Classes followed by Riding Classes (approx. 3:30 p.m.)
Friday, Aug. 25 - 1:00 p.m.: Quality Hitches
Friday, Aug. 25 – 7:00 p.m.: Log Pulling & Exhibition Sled Race
Saturday, Aug. 26 – 10:00 a.m.: Youth Showmanship
Saturday, Aug. 26 – 3:00 p.m.: Performance Hitches
Sunday, Aug. 27 – 1:00 p.m.: Gambler's Choice followed by Fun Day Events: Wagon Obstacle, Log Pulling and Sled Race.
 - RELEASE:** All Exhibitors must obtain a **"Release Slip"** from the Department Superintendent for transportation of livestock off the grounds. Draft Horses will be released at 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 27, but are welcome to stay until Monday morning, Aug. 28. **NO EARLY RELEASES.**

10. All animals shall be entered in the owner's name. The date of computing age shall be January 1. No animals will be accepted for entry unless they are in show condition.
11. Prior to judging, the Superintendent will inspect exhibits in the department to determine if they are entered in the proper class. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office in order for a change to be made.
12. **All stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily.** Exhibitors must be prepared to care for animals all day. Exhibitors are responsible for care and security of their tack and equipment.
13. Exhibitors must be prepared to show registration papers on all stallions entered.
14. The Management reserves the right to reject, accept conditionally and to cancel any entries and award prizes without claim for damages.
15. The Superintendent reserves the right to combine a class with only one entry.
16. An exhibitor who violates any of the rules set forth in this Premium Book will forfeit all privileges and premiums. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the rules and regulations in the front of the Premium Book. **Entry is deemed acceptance of the Rules.**
17. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the **Rules and Regulations** in front of this Premium Book and/or Website.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

Horses must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-of-state horses must meet Idaho Department of Agriculture import requirements and be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair.

For out-of-state Stallions, 12 months and older: the issuing veterinarian must write one of the four statements relative to Equine Viral Arteritis (EVA) "status" on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. These EVA status statements are found and defined in the Idaho State Department of Agriculture's Animal Import Rules IDAPA 02.04.21 and on the Idaho State Department of Agriculture's website - <http://www.agri.idaho.gov/Categories/Animals/importExport/indeximportexport.php>. Out-of-state horses **will be** required to have a valid (within the previous 12 months) Coggins (AGID or ELISA) test. All horses and mules should be vaccinated for infectious respiratory diseases transmitted animal-to-animal such as Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus at least 30 days prior to exhibition. A West Nile Virus Vaccination is not required, but recommended. WNV is transmitted only from bird to mosquito to horse (NOT horse to horse and NOT from horse to mosquito to horse). All horses are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. Please contact your veterinarian to discuss appropriate vaccinations well in advance of the Fair.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The Western Idaho Fair will award a special **Barn Prize** of \$25 to the exhibitor with the best-kept and decorated stall area and best-cleaned aisle. Judging for this award will be done both in the a.m. and p.m.

The Western Idaho Fair will award a trophy for each of the following: Supreme Champion Stallion, Supreme Champion Gelding, Supreme Champion Mare, First Place Log Pulling and First Place Exhibition Sled Race in both sections A and B. (There must be a minimum of 2 entries for trophies to be awarded.)

The Western Idaho Fair will award a trophy to First Place in each of the three **Fun Day** events.

Kathy Ross – Adrian, OR, will present an award to the winner of the Junior High Point Award. Ages 18 and under. Classes 40, 41, 43, 44 & 45. Points for Hi Point are as follows: 1st – 5, 2nd – 4, 3rd – 3, 4th – 2, 5th & under – 1 point.

Additional Rules for Quality and Performance Hitches:

1. All harness, equipment and vehicles will be subject to a safety inspection. **Every precaution should be taken by the exhibitor to insure the safety of others.**
2. In all Hitch Classes where the Judging criteria are not listed, manner of scoring will be up to the Judge. In all cases, **Judges Decisions Are Final.**
3. No Premiums will be paid to entries that did not have a complete and qualified run. This includes classes that pay “all others”.
4. Hitches of four, six or eight in hand, constitute **one** driver with that many horses **in his/her hands**. A penalty will be imposed if the driver requires assistance with the lines while competing.
5. Contestants experiencing an equipment breakdown may request a 3 minute gate hold.
6. Neat Western attire is required for Driver and assistants in all Hitch classes. Long dresses are optional for ladies.
7. **Entry Fee** for all Hitches and Log Pulling is \$3 per class and must accompany entry.
8. Other Draft Breeds (Section B) will not compete directly with the Shire, Percheron, Belgian, Clydesdale and Suffolk (Section A) breeds in Division 8 (Quality Hitches), Division 9 (Log Pulling) and Division 11 (Performance Hitches), but will show directly after those breeds finish their classes.

Followed by an Exhibition Sled Race

Class:

- 38. Team Log Pulling.....\$100 \$75 \$50 \$35 All others: \$25
Rules: Teams will pull two 16-foot logs through five pylons spaced 16 feet apart. Ropes will be 32 feet apart. Each contestant will start with 100 points. Five points will be subtracted for each infraction. Infractions will be stepping on or over ropes or moving the pylons. Breaking the pattern will be a disqualification. The contestant with the highest score will win. The event will be timed in case of a tie in points. Pylons will be reset as necessary during the competition. Exhibitors may enter and drive as many teams as they wish, but all teams must be ready when event is called. Order will be drawn in arena before class.
- 39. Single Horse Pulling.....\$50 \$45 \$30 \$25 All others: \$20
Rules as in Class 38. **One entry per exhibitor.**

Western Idaho Fair will award a trophy to first place in both classes.

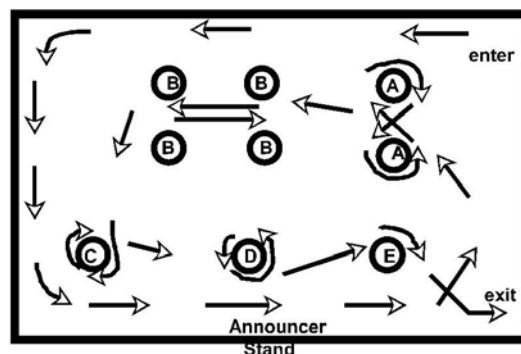

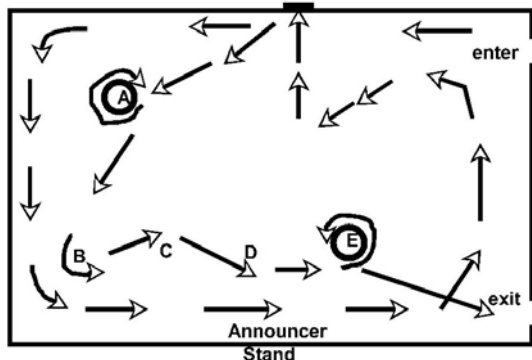
PATTERN # 1, Classes 42 – 45



- Enter at a trot, circle entire arena counter clockwise.
1. Figure 8 around markers “A”, spaced 36 feet apart
 2. Stop and back. Stop with back wheels even with marker “B” and back until front wheels are even with marker “B”.
 3. Circle marker “C” to the right with rear wheel as close to marker as possible without touching or knocking it over.
 4. Circle marker “D” to the left with rear wheel as close to marker as possible without touching or knocking it over.
 5. Drive around marker “E” then exit and line up.

- 6. Classes will be judged on driver ability and horse's handiness.

PATTERN # 2, Classes 46 – 50



- Enter at a trot, circle entire arena counter clockwise.
1. Back to loading dock within boundary and continue. Fanning should be shown while docking.
 2. Circle marker "A" with rear wheel as close as possible to marker without touching or knocking it over. This is a **right turn**.
 3. Drive through markers "B", "C" and "D".
 4. Circle marker "E" with rear wheel as close as possible to marker without touching or knocking it over. This is a **left turn**.
 5. Exit and line up.
 6. Classes will be judged on driver ability and horse's handiness.

Note: While there is no class for an Eight Horse Hitch, anyone wishing to hook eight will receive \$60. They will not be judged but will perform immediately following class 51 (Exhibition Driving).

In all performance hitches, contestants will compete one at a time, exit arena and line up, then return to arena when all have competed.

Judge will allow 25% match, 25% horsemanship and performance, 20% draftiness, 20% action & manner of move and 10% equipment.

- 48. Team-Senior Driving, Pattern 2.....\$50 \$45 \$40 \$35 \$25
Driver must be 60 yrs or older. Judged on driving ability only
- 49. Four Up – Pattern 2\$85 \$75 \$65 \$60 \$50
Must be driven in suitable wagon and harness. In Four in Hand, Judge will allow 25% draftiness, 12 ½ % matching, 12 ½ % equipment, 50% performance & horsemanship.
- 50. Six Up – Pattern 2\$200 \$180 \$160 \$140 \$125
Must be driven in suitable wagon and harness. In Six in Hand Judge will allow 25% draftiness, 12 ½ % matching, 12 ½ % equipment, 50% performance & horsemanship.
- 51. Exhibition Driving – Hook any number desired. They will not be judged. Exhibition money of \$5 per head hooked will be paid.
- 52. Farm Team\$50 \$45 \$40 \$35 \$25
May pull suitable wagon or other farm machinery. Equipment must be clean. Team will be judged on how well they work together & respond to driver's commands. Driving pattern will be set by the judge.

- 53. Gamblers Choice Driving – **Cart:** Driver to enter arena and negotiate obstacles. Obstacles will have varying degrees of difficulty and will have corresponding point values assigned them. Drivers can choose which obstacles they wish to attempt. Each obstacle may be negotiated twice, but there must be another obstacle attempted before the second attempt. If any obstacle is disturbed during an attempt, it may not be attempted again. Some obstacles may be designed to be knocked down. They will be set back up for the second attempt. There will be a two-minute time limit. When the announcer gives notification that the two minutes have expired, the competitor may finish any obstacle they have started before crossing the start, finish line. No galloping or loping, it is walk or trot only. To be timed in case of tie.
- 54. Gamblers Choice Driving – **Wagon:** Rules as above
