ENTRY: Entries close **Aug. 4**. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **Any late entries are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 8.** Payment must be made with entry. Only Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

1. **ENTRIES:** The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Online entries are encouraged. Entry forms must be completely filled out and must include the herd name, names and registration numbers of all goats entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam. **Exhibitor leaving off herd name will forfeit the right to compete for Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor.** All animals shown in Group classes must have been shown in their regular individual age class. Group classes may be listed as "Entry", **except the Sire and Dam classes which MUST have the sire or dam listed.**
No doe may compete in more than one class, or receive more than one premium, except as part of a pair, group or Championship. Goats in Group classes may not participate as part of two separate groups in group classes.
Exhibitors may make as many entries in individual classes as needed. **A maximum of two entries per Exhibitor will be allowed in group classes, unless stated. No Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class. Exhibitors MUST use separate entry forms for each breed. Submit the forms as one entry, but do not mix breeds on one form.**
2. **FEES:** Dairy Goats: A fee of \$3.00 per entry per class will be charged (\$6.00 per class if late entry accepted) for both individual as well as group classes. No pen fee will be charged. Please indicate how many pens you want to reserve. (Pens are 6' x 6', a maximum of 3 adults or 6 kids under 6 months of age will be allowed per pen).
3. **CHECK-IN:** All registration papers must be checked in with the show committee by 5:00 p.m. Wed. Aug. 23. No other check-in times are available. Substitutions will be allowed during check-in. No late check-in or substitutions will be

allowed at the Premium Office. All exhibitors have an entry deadline. Have paperwork in order prior to arrival at the Fair.

The Show Management reserves the right to accept post entries only to complete breed classes for sanctions. No refunds on entry fees. **RINGSIDE Entries are prohibited.** A registration/recording certificate for all does six months of age and older is required. ADGA stamped duplicate application dated less than 30 days prior to Aug. 23, 2017, or registration/recording certificate is accepted for does six months of age and younger only. **No photo copies** will be accepted. No-notice registration verification for any doe may be called for at any time.

4. **PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$20.00 for every three animals entered. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
5. **PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. For more information see General Rules and information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
6. **CAMPING:** See General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
7. **ARRIVAL: Dairy Goats** may arrive on the grounds between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. Wed. Aug. 23. Those arriving prior to 7:00 a.m. need to contact Superintendent for stall assignment. No goats are allowed to arrive after 10:00 a.m. without Department Superintendent permission and current vet certificate. **NO unloading will be allowed before 5:00 a.m. Wednesday. Do not set up awnings on the north end of the building until after 10:00 a.m.**

9. **RELEASE:** Exhibits must remain in place until 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 27, but are welcome to stay until Monday morning. All exhibitors must obtain a **“Release Slip”** from the Department Superintendent for transportation of livestock from the grounds. **Exhibitors leaving early without the permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all awards due them.**
10. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the **Rules & Regulations** in front of this Premium Book or Website.
11. **SANCTION:** This is an ADGA Sanctioned Show (Junior Does and Senior Does are separately sanctioned). **“ADGA” RULES SHALL GOVERN. The order of the show is not subject to change.**
12. **Showing animals in the Champion Challenge Class:** The prefix CH, GCH, or SGCH as affixed by ADGA must be on the animal’s registration/recordation certificate, or presentation of the notification letter, issued by ADGA, in conjunction with the original registration/recordation certificate. **The letter is valid for use until December 31 of the year of issuance,** after which the certificate of registration/recordation must be officially updated.
13. **All livestock pens and stalls** are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily. Do not enter more goats than you can properly manage.
14. **When completing entry forms exhibitors must put the herd name on the entries. Any animal without full herd name will NOT be counted for Premium Breeder. Sire and Dam names are not required on the entry form. Please add the individual tattoos on the entry form.**



HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All dairy goats must be properly dehorned, sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All goats of any age must be identified with a Federal Scrapie Program identification number. Out-of-state goats must have a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair and an Entry Permit (call the Idaho Sheep and Goat Health Board at 208-334-3315). A negative Brucellosis test is not necessary for **temporary** entry of dairy goats into the state for show purposes only (no sales or transfer of ownership to Idaho residents). All goats are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. Milk from lactating dairy goats will be discarded.

WESTERN IDAHO FAIR MILKING COMPETITION

Rules:

- 1. Entry Fee: \$3.00 per entry per class. (\$6.00 if late entry accepted)
- 2. **This show is sanctioned by ADGA** and their rules shall govern.
- 3. Goats must be entered in their appropriate breeding class. Goats will compete in their own breed division. Exhibitors must provide their own milking equipment.
- 4. The owner shall certify in writing to the Superintendent and to ADGA the goat has not received milk, thyroprotein or any tonic or condition powder which states on the label it will increase milk production within 10 days of test. This certificate shall be completed and signed by the owner in presence of the Superintendent on the day of milk-out.
- 5. Goats shall be milked dry and stripped dry in the show ring under supervision of the official tester 24 hours before the hour set for the final milking. Milk out (first milking) will be at 7:00 a.m. Thursday, Aug. 24.
- 6. There will be three milkings. The second milking will take place in the show ring at 7:00 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 24, and the final milking will take place at 7:00 a.m. Friday, Aug. 25.
- 7. Points will be awarded as follows;
 - a. For each pound of milk, one point figured to one decimal.
 - b. For each complete ten days the goat has been in milk since last kidding one tenth (.1) of a point, with maximum of 3.6 points.
 - c. For each .05 pounds of butterfat yielded in the milkings, one point.
 - d. Information will be sent to ADGA for any animal earning 18 or more points for a Star Milker designation.

1. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** All goats must be properly dehorned/disbudded, sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. No horned animals may be exhibited. Out-of-state goats must have a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair and an Entry Permit (call the Idaho Sheep and Goat Health Board at 208-334-3315). A negative Brucellosis test is not necessary for **temporary** entry of goats into the state for show purposes only (no sales or transfer of ownership to Idaho residents). All goats are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.
2. Rules 1, 4, 5, 6 in the General Rules and Regulations Section. All animals must be properly cared for and in good condition. Animals shown in Wether Classes must not show characteristics of any breed other than Pygmy Goat. The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds or from the display any animal it deems unsuitable for exhibition. Please carefully read the **Rules and Regulations** at the front of this Premium Book or Website and all rules in this section.
3. **FEES:** An entry fee of \$10.00 per pen will be charged (\$20.00 per pen if late.) Pens are 6' x 6'. Pygmy goats will be allowed a maximum of 4 adults or 6 kids per pen. **Each exhibitor must pay a pen fee.**
Do not enclose pen fees for tack pens. There is no charge for tack pens. They will be available **ONLY** after all animals have been assigned pens. Tack space when assigned must be shared if necessary.

4. Entries and Eligibility for Premiums:

- **For Classes 1 – 4:** Include the name and age of exhibitor.
- **For Classes 5 – 34** (Champion classes excluded): include the full name of the animal, date of birth, sire and dam, and (for NPGA Classes) registration number. See class descriptions of 35 – 37 for entry form requirements. Please double-check your animal's paperwork against your entry form.

In addition to other applicable rules in this premium book/website, **each Pygmy Goat exhibitor must have paid a pen fee** under his/her name, as an individual Open Class Pygmy Goat exhibitor, to claim a premium in the Open Show.

Note: 4-H/FFA Pygmy Goat exhibitors are welcome and encouraged to compete in the Open Show, **but EACH must submit an Open Class Livestock entry form and pay the fees applicable for open classes.** See the Junior Exhibitors Handbook for more information about the 4-H/FFA Show.

5. **PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$20.00 for every three animals entered. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
6. **PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. For more information see General Rules and information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
7. **CAMPING:** See General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
8. **ARRIVAL TIME:** Pygmy Goat exhibitors may arrive Thursday evening, Aug. 17, but must be on the grounds before 10:00 a.m. on Friday, Aug. 18. Placement of livestock will be determined by the Show Chairperson. In the event of any conflict, the decision of the Department Superintendent or the Livestock Director will be final. **Animals will be health checked by Show Chairman before entering the barn.**
9. **RELEASE:** Pygmy Goat exhibits will be released at 10:00 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 21 and **must be out** of the barn by 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 22. Any exhibitor who removes, allows to be removed, or participates in the removal of a Pygmy Goat from the fairgrounds site without the Chairperson's, Superintendent's or Livestock Director's

express written permission may be barred from future exhibitor participation at the Western Idaho Fair, and will immediately forfeit any premiums awarded.

10. **National Pygmy Goat Association (NPGA) rules will govern all Pygmy Goat Classes and supersede all other rules.** Only NPGA-registered does may compete in the NPGA-sanctioned doe and group classes. All tattooing must be done before commencement of the sanctioned show. For NPGA-sanctioned classes, the animal's original NPGA registration certificate shall be presented to the Show Chairperson for examination at check-in and must be available for the judge's inspection at show time.

NPGA rosettes will be issued only to NPGA animals; Western Idaho Fair rosettes will be issued to all champions.

11. **Show check-in and substitutions:** All open show exhibitors must check in with the Pygmy Goat Show Chairperson during the health check.

All substitutions must be made at or before the check-in and must be approved by the Pygmy Goat Chairperson.

Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor awards will be given only when there is competition between two or more exhibitors.
