ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 3. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **Any late entries are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 7.** Payment must be made with entry. Only Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

1. The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and registration number of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam. Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.**
2. **FEES: Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, Santa Gertrudis and Exhibit Only Cattle:** An entry fee of \$12.00 per head will be charged. (\$24.00 per head if late entry accepted.)
Texas Longhorn: An entry fee of \$40.00 per class will be charged (\$52.00 if late entry accepted.)
Junior Angus: \$10 per head. **No refunds on entry fees.**
3. **PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$20.00 for every two animals entered. **Remittance for entry fees and exhibitor passes must accompany entries.**
4. **PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. For more information see General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
5. **CAMPING:** See **General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.**
6. **ARRIVAL:** Angus exhibits may arrive Wednesday, Aug. 15, after 8:00 a.m. and must be in place by 6:00 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 16. Other Beef Breed exhibitors may arrive after 6:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 22 and must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. that day.

 1. **RELEASE:** Angus will be released at 10:00 p.m., Monday, Aug. 20, and must be out of the barn by 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 21. Other Breeds must remain in place until 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 26. **All exhibitors must possess a "release slip" from the department Superintendent for transportation of livestock from the grounds. Exhibitors leaving early without the permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all awards due them.**
 2. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the **Rules and Regulations** in front of this Premium Book and/or Website.
 3. All animals entered for competition must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor. Registration certificates must accompany all animals and be presented prior to judging. Registration certificates must be in the name of the owner or co-owner. Any transfer of animals must have been made prior to the Fair and the registration certificate must indicate the name of the current owner. Registration papers will be

checked by the breed representative or his agent prior to judging.

4. **Substitutions will be allowed up to 24 hours prior to judging.** Substitutions will be allowed on a 1 for 1 basis within the same breed and must be of the same sex. **Ringside entry of single animals is prohibited.** Any animal substituted must have current registration certificate and meet requirements set forth in Rule # 10 above.
5. Stalls will be assigned prior to the Fair by Western Idaho Fair personnel.
6. Prior to judging, the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to a clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office for a change to be made.
7. The Management of the Fair reserves the right to refuse admittance or remove from the Fairgrounds all unmanageable animals that may endanger public safety.
8. All animals, except calves, must have an extra neck rope. BULLS, yearlings and older, must be shown with nose tongs. No nurse cows stalled in the barn.
9. Livestock pens and stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily.
10. Electrical power in the livestock barn is limited. Exhibitors are permitted to bring generators if they desire.
11. There will be a designated area outside of the Livestock Barn where **“blocking chutes” may be placed.**
12. **TIE-OUTS:** Exhibitors using tie-out areas at night can take animals out of the barn after **9:00 p.m.** Night tie-out area is limited. Tie-out area must have manure removed and pavement swept each a.m.
13. There will be an exhibitor’s meeting held for each section of the Fair. The Superintendent will announce the time and place.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All cattle must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. **All sexually intact beef-breed cattle over 18 months of age must possess one of the following forms of official identification: USDA silver metal tag (Brite tag); USDA orange metal Bang’s tag (females only); or RFID (radio-frequency identification) 840 tag.** Cattle originating from in-state locations must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) dated no earlier than 30 days, that verifies general soundness and good health.

Out-of-state cattle shall meet all Idaho livestock import requirements set forth in IDAPA 02.04.21, Rules Governing the Importation of Animals, prior to entry into Idaho. All cattle require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days prior to entry into Idaho and must possess official individual identification, as stated above. **Vaccination/Testing Requirements:** Non-brucellosis-vaccinated females may enter into Idaho for the purpose of show or exhibition only, but require an Entry Permit. Entry permits are required for all intact beef bulls. **Entry Permits:** Livestock entry permits must be obtained by the exhibitors attending veterinarian no greater than 72 hours prior to entry, via the online ISDA entry permit system or via phone @ 208.332.8540.

Out-of-state bulls, imported for exhibition at livestock shows are not required to be tested for Trichomoniasis, provided they will be returned to state of origin, will not be exposed to female cattle, and will not be offered for sale. All intact male and female cattle over eighteen (18) months of age coming from the Designated Surveillance Areas of Montana and Wyoming shall be officially individual identified and must have a negative brucellosis test

within thirty (30) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho. All cattle are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

All cattle for breeding or for sale purposes at the Fair, must meet the Idaho change-of-ownership requirements. See “IDAPA 11.02.01 Rules of the Idaho Brand Board”, which can be found at: <http://adminrules.idaho.gov/rules/current/11/0201.pdf>.

SPECIAL AWARDS

DIVISION 3 **SHORTHORNS AND POLLED SHORTHORNS**

Thursday, Aug. 23 – 9:00 a.m. Junior Show
10:00 a.m. Open Show



All cattle must be purebred and have original registration papers (no copies or faxes accepted) to be eligible to show.

All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Shorthorn Association, 8288 Hascall Street, Omaha, NE 68124 as of a date prior to the opening of the Fair or Show.

Family-bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in open classes may be treated as family entries in group classes. Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multi-owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the Association. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the American Shorthorn Association and the decision of the examining veterinarian is final. Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.

IMPORTANT: Each of the following classes **MAY** be broken into multiple classes to accommodate large numbers of entries, but separate classes **MAY NOT** be combined into one. For example, there **MAY** be four “Junior Heifer Calf” classes, but there **MAY NOT** be one single “Spring Heifer Calf” class (combining Late and Early Spring calves).

Female Classes: – Entry in this show binds the exhibitor to all regulations pertaining thereto.

1. Late Spring Heifer Calves, calved after May 1, 2018
2. **Late Spring Heifer Calf Champion** (chosen from 1st place winners in Class 1)
3. **Late Spring Heifer Calf Reserve Champion** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners in Class 1)
4. Early Spring Heifer Calves, calved April 2018
5. Early Spring Heifer Calves, calved March 2018
6. **Early Spring Heifer Calf Champion** (chosen from 1st place winners in Class 4 & 5)
7. **Early Spring Heifer Calf Reserve Champion** chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners in Class 4 & 5)
8. Junior Heifer Calves, calved February, 2018
9. Junior Heifer Calves, calved January, 2018
10. **Junior Heifer Calf Champion** (chosen from 1st place winners in Class 8 & 9)
11. **Reserve Junior Heifer Calf Champion** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners in Class 8 & 9)
12. Winter Heifer Calves, calved Nov. – Dec., 2017
13. Senior Heifer Calves, calved Sept. – Oct., 2017
14. **Senior Heifer Calf Champion** (chosen from 1st place winners in Classes 12 & 13)
15. **Reserve Senior Heifer Calf Champion** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners in Classes 12 & 13)
16. Summer Yearling Females, calved July – Aug., 2017
17. Late Spring Yearling Females, calved May – June, 2017

21. **Junior Champion Female** (chosen from 1st place winners from Class 20)
22. **Reserve Junior Champion Female** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners from Class 20)
23. Junior Yearling Females, calved Jan. – Feb., 2017
24. Senior Yearling Females, calved Sept. through Dec., 2016
25. **Senior Champion Female** (chosen from 1st place winners in Classes 23 & 24)
26. **Reserve Senior Champion Female** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners in Classes 23 & 24)
27. Two Year Old Cow/Calf Class: cows born between Jan. 1, 2016 – Aug. 31, 2016 (see note on page 12 entering cow/calf)
28. Three-Four Year Old Cow/Calf Class: cows born between Jan. 1, 2014 – Dec. 31, 2015
Both Cow and Calf must be **Purebred Shorthorn** – Calf age may not exceed 280 days of age on show day.
29. **Grand Champion Cow/Calf Pair** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 27 & 28)
30. **Reserve Grand Champion Cow/Calf Pair** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 27 & 28)
31. **Grand Champion Shorthorn Female** (chosen from Late Spring Calf, Early Spring Calf, Junior Calf, Senior Calf, Intermediate, Junior, Senior and Cow/Calf Pair Champion females)
32. **Reserve Grand Champion Shorthorn Female** (chosen from Late Spring Calf, Early Spring Calf, Junior Calf, Senior Calf, Intermediate, Junior, Senior and Cow/Calf Pair Champion females)
33. Group of Two Females: **Bred and owned or co-owned** by the breeder (exhibitor)

Senior/Junior Yearling pregnancy rule for exhibitors:

If a Purebred Female has a ShorthornPlus calf at side, it is not eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show, however it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus show. All females 20 months old at the time of the show need to have a 60-day pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show and are subject to blood test to prove pregnancy. Exhibitors may be asked to present said verification upon the request of the Show officials or ASA representatives. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site, and verify a 60-day pregnancy. Any infractions against this rule will lead to disqualification of that animal for that specific show.

Bull Classes: - Entry in this show binds the exhibitor to all regulations pertaining thereto.

47. Summer Yearling Bulls, calved July – Aug., 2017
48. Late Spring Yearling Bulls, calved May – June, 2017
49. **Intermediate Champion Bull** (chosen from 1st place winners in Classes 47 & 48)
50. **Reserve Intermediate Champion Bull** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners in Classes 47 & 48)
51. Early Spring Yearling Bulls, calved March – April, 2017
52. Junior Yearling Bulls, calved Jan. – Feb., 2017

58. **Reserve Senior Champion Bull** (chosen from 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 55 & 56)
59. **Grand Champion Bull** (chosen from Late Spring Calf, Early Spring Calf, Junior Calf, Senior Calf, Intermediate, Junior and Senior Champion Bulls)
60. **Reserve Grand Champion Bull** (chosen from Late Spring Calf, Early Spring Calf, Junior Calf, Senior Calf, Intermediate, Junior and Senior Champion and Reserve Champion Bulls)
61. Group of Two Bulls: **Bred and owned or co-owned** by the breeder (exhibitor)
62. Super Cow Class: Class should consist of two (2) offspring of **either or same** sex of show age classification. Offspring **do not** need to be owned by the same exhibitor. No more than one pair from each cow can win a prize in the class.
63. Get-of-Sire: Class should consist of three offspring of **either or same** sex of any age from the same sire. Offspring **do not** need to be owned by the same exhibitor. No more than one group from each sire can win a prize in the class.
64. Breeders Herd – class should consist of **4 offspring owned or co-owned** by the exhibitor or working family (i.e. Father, Mother, Brothers, Sisters, Aunts & Uncles).

IDAHO STATE GROUP CLASSES – The following classes are reserved for Idaho Breeders only.

65. Pair of Calves: Both sexes represented, shown in individual classes 1, 4, 7, 10, 11, 34, 37 or 40, and must be owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
66. Pair of Females: Shown in individual classes, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
67. Pair of Bulls: Shown in individual classes, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
68. Progeny of Dam: Two animals, either or both sexes, embryo transplant or natural, shown in individual classes, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
69. Best Pair: Both sexes represented, shown in individual classes, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
70. Exhibitor's Best Five Head: Both sexes represented, shown in individual classes, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR: This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most money in the individual classes on the top eight (8) animals owned and exhibited by him.

NOTE: Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor. This award will be given only when there is competition between two or more exhibitors.

Note:

When entering Cow/Calf classes list **ONLY** the Cow Information on the entry form. (Listing the calf's info as well will result in a double entry)
