

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 3. Entries must be postmarked by this date. Any late entries are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent. You may submit your entries online. Online deadline is Aug. 7. Payment must be made with entry. Only Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com. A \$2 per exhibitor convenience fee applies.

- The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and registration number (if registered) of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers (if registered) of both sire and dam.
- 2. **FEES:** An entry fee of \$7.00 per head will be charged (\$14.00 per head if late.) Llamas for **Exhibit Only** will not be charged an entry fee. **No refunds on entry fees.**
- 3. **PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$20.00 each for every three animals entered. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
- 4. PARKING: Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. Exhibitor with pass must display parking permit in vehicle window for admission at livestock entrance. All livestock exhibitors will enter the Fairgrounds on Backstretch Blvd. off Glenwood Street. For more information see General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
- CAMPING: See General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
- ARRIVAL: Llamas/Alpacas may arrive on Thursday, Aug. 16 after 5:00 p.m., but must be on the grounds by Friday, Aug. 17 10:00 a.m. Any change from specified arrival time must have special permission from the Department Superintendent.
- 7. RELEASE: Llamas/Alpacas will be released at 10:00 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 20. Vehicular movement will not be allowed before 10:30 p.m., but animals are allowed to be walked out. A "Release Slip" will be required for transportation of livestock from the grounds. Release slips are issued by the Superintendent. Exhibitors checking out must

- leave a clean stall. Exhibitors leaving early without permission of the Superintendent forfeit all awards due them.
- Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the information listed under Rules and Regulations in the printed section or on the website.
- 9. All Llamas/Alpacas shall be entered under the owner's name, with handler's name noted additionally if needed.
- Stalls will be assigned prior to the Fair by Western Idaho Fair personnel.
- 11. Prior to judging, the Superintendent will inspect all entry forms to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office in order for a change to be made.
- Female llamas/alpacas with nursing crias may be entered for display only.
- 13. **No large** "For Sale" signs will be exhibited in llama barn. Llamas/Alpacas available for purchase may be posted discreetly by means of a 3x5 card on the stall.
- 14. Stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily. Exhibitors are responsible for care and security of their llamas/alpacas, tack and equipment, and the cleanliness of their stalls and adjacent aisle and arena areas. Shared tack areas will be identified.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Llamas/Alpacas must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-of-state llamas/alpacas must meet Idaho import requirements. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) should be dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fairgrounds. All llamas/alpacas are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. If a llama/alpaca is observed to be ill, injured, diseased or of a condition that threatens the health of other llamas, the Llama & Alpaca Superintendent will take prompt action to remedy the situation and to notify the exhibitor/owner.

LLAMA/ALPACA ACCOMMODATIONS

Llamas/Alpacas will be housed in stalls pre-assigned by Western Idaho Fair personnel, as entries come in, with no more than two llamas or three alpacas per stall. The Western Town Barn floor is packed sand; other appropriate floor coverings may be used. Sawdust and wood shavings are prohibited. Water and electricity are available in the barn. Night security will be provided.

FARM AND RANCH DISPLAYS

Commercial Displays: Space is available for farm, ranch, and/or Llama/Alpaca-related commercial displays.

SHOW INFORMATION

- Participants are encouraged to enter as many Divisions as desired, but no Exhibitor will be allowed more than three (3) premiums in any one class.
- Alpaca Fleece Show Scoring will be based on the most recent AOA scoring criteria.
- Color Classes for Alpacas are based on AOA color designation. "Light" shall include all colors through Dawn Fawn.
- 4. Gambler's Choice Each participant will be given 1 minute 30 seconds to complete as many obstacles as possible.
- ALL class changes must be made twenty four (24) hours prior to the beginning of the show (per show day), except scratching.
- 6. No Llama/Alpaca shall participate more than once in each eligible class.
- 7. All llamas participating in PACK classes must be at least eighteen (18) months of age or older.
- 8. Exhibiter attire should be neat, clean and appropriate to the event.
- For all classes exhibitors are <u>required</u> to wear close-toed shoes.
- All display and/or show llamas/alpacas are expected to be surface groomed.
- 11. There shall be no decorations or tassels on halters, except for the Costume Class.
- 12. No children under the age of ten will be allowed to show intact adult male llamas/alpacas over the age of 24 months.
- 13. Base dates: Youth exhibitors: January 1st of current year. Animals: Date of the Show.
- 14. Every attempt will be made to adhere to show schedule as printed; however, the ring steward reserves the right to adjust the schedule as deemed necessary. Exhibitors should be ready to show earlier or later than scheduled times.
- 15. To qualify for Grand or Reserve Champion Performance Llama/Alpaca, entries are eligible by a point total from classes completed by a handler using the **same animal in both required classes.** The required classes include the Pack Obstacle and Gambler's Choice for Llama and the PR Obstacle and Gambler's Choice for Alpaca. A handler may enter multiple animals in the same class, not to exceed 4 animals per handler for each class.
- 16. Ribbons for Divisions 4, 5, 8, and 9 will be based on the Handler number and not the animal number.

SPECIAL BARN AWARD

Herdsmanship Award: The Western Idaho Fair will present a Special Rosette daily, Aug. 17 through Aug. 20, to recognize outstanding exhibitor stall areas. Handling and care of llamas/alpacas, being a good host or hostess, cleanliness of stalls, aisles and adjacent areas, attractiveness of area and educational qualities of area will be taken into consideration by judges. A special barn prize of \$25 will be given by the Western Idaho Fair.

PREMIUMS

Ribbons will be awarded to first through fourth place winners in all Divisions and Premiums will be awarded in Divisions 2-5 and 8-10, except the Championship Classes. Grand and Reserve Grand Champions will all receive Rosettes.

PREMIUMS: 1st - \$30 2nd - \$25 3rd - \$20 4th - \$15

NOTE: All classes shall have a minimum of 3 animals per class. Classes that fall below that will be combined. For example, classes for the Huacaya Female Alpaca will be combined if either class has fewer than 3 alpacas. To award a Champion/Reserve Champion, combined classes must have a minimum of 5 animals.
