Please Note: You must be 18 years of age to enter this department. See Department 19 for all Youth entries, age 17 & younger.

How to enter:

Bring in your entries with the entry form(s) to the Fairgrounds on **Monday**, **Aug. 15 or Tuesday**, **Aug. 16 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** Entries will be taken in the North Expo Building. <u>If you want to enter early and reduce time spent in line on entry days, you have the following 2 options:</u>

- 1. a) Mail or deliver ONLY your entry form(s) to the Premium Office, 5610 Glenwood, Boise ID 83714 by August 9.
 - b) Then bring your entries to the Fairgrounds on Aug. 15 or Aug. 16 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- OR 2. a) Enter online by Aug. 9 at www.idahofair.com. Follow the link to Competitive Exhibits. The Western Idaho Fair will cover the \$2 convenience fee. There will be no charge to enter online unless a Professional or Advanced Amateur fee applies.
 - b) Then bring your entries to the Fairgrounds on Aug. 15 or Aug. 16 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- 1. Entries: Will be received in the North Wing of the Exposition Building. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Articles must be entered by the exhibitor or an authorized agent. No article sent by parcel post or express will be accepted. Exhibitor may enter no more than THREE articles in the department (see exception is the Advanced Amateur Division and Professional Division), and only ONE in any class (exception is the Superintendent Photo Challenge, see rules under the Challenge). All competitive entries must have been taken during the last 24 months by the exhibitor. No items can be entered in the Western Idaho Fair more than one year. Photographers cannot enter photos in more than one Photographer Division (Professional, Advanced Amateur, Amateur, or Senior Vision). The one exception is anyone from any Photographer Division can also enter the Superintendent Photo Challenge.
- 2. Photo Entry Quantity for each Division
 - a. Amateur, Senior Vision, Exhibitor Photo Entry Quantity: Exhibitor may enter no more than THREE Photos in the department and only ONE in any class. The one exception is anyone from any Photography Division can also enter the Superintendent Photo Challenge. See rules under the Superintendent Photo Challenge.
- b. Professional, Advanced Amateur Exhibitor Photo Entry Quantity: Advanced Amateurs can submit up to four photos, but no more than three can be Color photos. You can submit three Color photos and one Monochrome photo, three Monochrome photos and one-Color photo, two Color and two Monochrome photos, or any combination, as long as you do not submit more than three photos in the Color class or three Monochrome photos in the Monochrome class. We are adding this to the Professional and Advanced Amateurs Division as an incentive to print more monochrome photos. Advanced Amateur is the only group that has a separate Color and Monochrome class. Photos submitted in the Superintendent Photo Challenge do not count against the four entries in this Division. See the rules under the Superintendent Photo Challenge. The Amateur and Senior Vision Divisions are still limited to entering no more than three total photos.
- 3. Division and Photographer Classes
 - a. Professional: A Professional is anyone who is currently charging or has charged fees for providing photography services of any kind, has photos in a gallery for sale, and/or teaches photography for fees. If you meet any of the qualifications for a Professional and knowingly enter photos

into the Amateur, Senior Vision, or Advanced Amateur Divisions, you will be disqualified, and all ribbons and premiums revoked. If after two years of NOT charging fees for providing photography services of any kind, has NOT had photos in a gallery for sale, and/or has NOT taught photography for fees, you can move back to Advanced Amateur Division.

- b. **Advanced Amateur:** An Advanced Amateur is an experienced member of camera clubs, photographer with formal photography education, experienced photographer who does not sell their photography.
- c. **Amateur:** New to photography, little experience in photography, little knowledge or photography training
- d. Senior Vision: Any photographer who is 65 or older. If you qualify as a Professional, you cannot enter the Senior Vision Class.
- e. **Superintendent Photography Challenge:** Open to all photographers. See award for special rules.

4. Entry Fees:

- a. An entry fee of \$8.00 per item will be charged to entries in the Professional Division.
- b. An entry fee of \$3.00 per item will be charged to entries in the Advanced Amateur Division.
- c. There is No fee to enter the Amateur or Senior Vision Divisions.
- d. For the special Superintendent Photography Challenge, the fee is \$25 per Challenge entered.
- 5. All articles entered shall be under the control of the Superintendent of this department. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of the exhibits, but the photographer assumes all responsibility in case of loss or theft and in no case will the Management of the Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendent be responsible for loss or injury of the same. The photos will be handled by many people, which can result in fingerprints and damage.
- 6. Judging: Wednesday, Aug. 17 at 8:00 a.m. The exhibit area will be closed during judging and will remain closed until all photographs have been placed for exhibit. Photos will be judged and awarded first, second, third, fourth, honorable mention or no awards (premium) according to the merits of the photo. Any questions as to exhibit classification or eligibility shall be referred to the Superintendent and the Judges. The Judge's decisions are final.
- 7. Premium Pay-Out: Awards will be available at the Premium Office. Copy of Exhibitor Entry Form should be presented for premium pay-out. Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 23 through Aug. 28 from 12:00 noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 29 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Aug. 30 through Sept. 9, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend, including the Friday prior to Labor Day. Awards not claimed by Sept. 9, 2022 will be considered a donation and will revert back to the Western Idaho Fair general fund.
- 8. Release: Monday, Aug. 29-10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. In no case may photos be removed before 10:00 a.m. Mon., Aug. 29.

 Photos which are not claimed within one week after the close of the fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the Manager of the Fair sees fit. Exhibitors must present claim checks corresponding with entry tags when claiming exhibits. Exhibits must not be removed without the Superintendent or assistants being present to check out entries.
- 9. **ADDITIONAL RULES:** Exhibitors are requested to read the General Rules of the Fair and Special Photography Department Rules. Department Rules supersede General Rules.

Special Photography Department Rules

- NO mats or frames will be allowed. Photos must be mounted on a hard-flat backing such as mat board or foam core. Cardboard or poster board is NOT an acceptable mount. Item must be firmly adhered to foam core or mat board so that the photograph is rigid & secure. (No cardboard, poster board, wood, glass, plastic, metal, or Formica) Items must be flush mounted (edge to edge). No mounting material can be showing behind the photograph. Mount cannot exceed 1/4 inch thick. No photography will be accepted unless mounted.
- No Borders of any size are allowed.
- Image size rules for each Division are listed within the Division's information. Prints outside the sizes defined for each Division will not be accepted.
- <u>Single Prints Only</u> A Composite photo is ok, but no <u>Collage Photos are allowed.</u>
- Monochrome: Monochrome prints consist of black, white and shades of gray in between. Toning is allowed, but must cover the entire image and be of a single color; e.g. sepia toning. Prints with spot color, selective color or that are covered with two or more colors must be entered in the Color Print Division.
- Prints must be on photographic paper; no metal or glass is allowed.
- Business Cards: After Judging, Professionals may place a business card on the lower left corner of their photos. Improperly displayed cards will be removed. No other Division can place a business card on the photos. Even if you qualify as a Professional, no business cards can be placed on Superintendent Photo Challenge photos.
- Identification: Each entry must have printed on the back in the top left corner, the department, division and class number in which the photo is entered along with the entrant's name, current address and telephone number. No writing or markings of any kind may be placed on the front of the photograph.

DIVISION 1 – PROFESSIONAL

Premiums: 1st - \$30 2nd - \$25 3rd - \$20 No 4th or HM

Professional: Definition of a Professional is anyone who is currently charging or has charged fees for providing photography services of any kind, has photos in a gallery for sale, and/or teaches photography for fees. If you meet any of the qualifications for a Professional and knowingly enter photos into the Amateur or Advanced Amateur Divisions, you will be disqualified, and all ribbons and premiums revoked.

An **entry fee of \$8.00 per item** will be charged only to entries in the Professional Division.

Image Size Rule: Images can be any size between 8" x 10" and 13" x 19". Prints above or below those dimensions will not be accepted. **Special Exception:** You can also submit a Square Image Size, but it has to be a perfect square, 10x10", 11x11", 12x12", 13x13", 14x14", 15x15", or 16x16".

Class:

- Abstracts Looking at an object in a way that it would not usually be seen. It often involves the use of color, light, shadow, texture, shape, patterns, and/or form to convey a feeling, sensation or impression.
- Aerial Photography Aerial photography shows a unique perspective, because the photos are taken from an aircraft, drone, balloon, kites, telescoping poles, or by other similar methods
- 3. **Animals** Any non-winged animals.
- 4. **Animals** Birds of Prey
- 5. Animals Winged Animals (not Birds of Prey).
- 6. **Architectural (exterior)** Images should consist of the exterior of a building(s), bridge(s), any man-made structure(s),

- dam(s), tower(s), etc. The architecture must be the main component and focus of the photograph.

- 9. **Cityscape** The urban equivalent of a landscape, a city skyline.
- 10. Creative Utilizes methods which present a fictional or conceptual image, or photographic art. Utilizes methods which alter the appearance of the image so that it is substantially different from the way it would normally appear to the human eye. Examples are: multiple exposures, high key/low key, zoom or uses of camera movement, adding textures or patterns, obvious change in natural color, form, and/or shape, and often a blending or composite image.
- Cultural Documents a specific unique group of people, and their life, their activities and/or ceremonies, whether at work or at play.
- 12. **Digital Photographic Arts** The image must start with a full-sized digital photograph, no exceptions. The photo can be manipulated, enhanced, or changed in any way using a computer and computer software to create your digital photobased art image. Special rules: 1) All work must be done on a computer. 2) Must be based on a full-sized digital photograph. 3) On the back of your submitted print, you must include a brief description of your process. 4) *You must attach two 4x6 prints of the original photograph to the back of your submitted photo*. Put them in a sandwich bag and tape the bag to the back of your submitted photo. The reason we are asking for two 4x6 prints is one will stay on the back of your submitted photo and the other 4x6 print will be placed next to your submitted photo on the wall. Now, the people viewing your Digital Photographic Art Photograph will see the original photo you started with.

Class 147 – Dark and Moody Photography Style (Color or Monochrome). - Notable for its deep and dramatic tones, moody images are always captivating in their own ways. On one hand, dark and moody is the way to go when your shots don't have good lighting. On the other, it's the way to go when you want to create dramatic images with deep and intense emotions. Class 148 – Shallow Depth of Field (Color or Monochrome) – A shallow depth of field usually comes from using a large aperture. Anything between f/1.2 and f/4.0 will separate the foreground from its background. You can use a shallow depth of field if the surroundings seem uninteresting, or you want to single out a point of interest. A shallow depth of field is an excellent way to make your subject stand out from its surroundings. This is why depth of field is perfect for subject isolation, head-shots, portraits, to blur out "ugly" backgrounds, etc....
