SUPERINTENDENT: Dennis Lincoln – Wilder, Idaho **JUDGE:**

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 3. Entries must be postmarked by this date. **Any late entries are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent.** You may submit your entries online. **Online deadline is Aug. 7.** Payment must be made with entry. Only Visa and MasterCard accepted online. <u>www.idahofair.com</u>.

1. The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair.

Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and registration number of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam.

Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than three premiums in any one individual class or two premiums in group classes.**

- 2. This show follows the guidelines of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Show Ring Code of Ethics. An exhibitor who violates any of those guidelines could forfeit all privileges and premiums.
- FEES: An entry fee of \$10.00 per head will be charged. (\$20.00 per head if late entry accepted.) No refunds on entry fees.
- 4. **PASSES:** Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor's tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$20.00 for every two animals entered. **Remittance** for entry fees and exhibitor passes **must accompany entries.**
- 5. **PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicleparking permits. For more information see General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
- 6. **CAMPING:** See General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
- 7. ARRIVAL: All open class Dairy Cattle may arrive after 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 22, and must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 23. No vehicular movement will be allowed inside the paid admission area during the hours the Fair is open to the public. Livestock arriving on Tuesday, Aug. 22, prior to 11:00 p.m. must be walked in. Any change

from specified arrival time must have special permission from the Department Superintendent.

- JUDGING SCHEDULE: Saturday, Aug. 26 – 10:00 a.m. – All Breeds Supreme Champion Cow Award and Supreme Best Three Females following the show.
- 9. RELEASE: All Dairy Cattle will be released at 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 27, but are welcome to stay until Monday morning, Aug. 28. A 'Release Slip' will be required for transportation of livestock from the grounds. The department Superintendent issues release slips. Exhibitors leaving early without permission of the Superintendent forfeit all awards due them.
- 10. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the <u>rules and</u> <u>regulations</u> in the front of the Premium Book and/or Website.
- 11. All exhibitors entering animals for competition must show title of ownership on registration certificates to accompany any animal prior to judging. Any transfer of animal exhibiting must have been made in new owner's name prior to Fair date. The breed representative or his agent will check all registration papers.
- 12. Stalls will be assigned prior to the Fair by Western Idaho Fair personnel.
- Substitutions will be allowed 24 hours prior to Fair judging. Ringside entries of single animals are prohibited. Entries must be made in group classes.
- 14. Prior to judging the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office for a change to be made.
- 15. The Management of the Fair reserves the right to refuse admittance or remove from the Fairgrounds all unmanageable or unsightly animals which may endanger the public safety or be unfit for exhibition.

- 16. No blocking chutes will be allowed inside the Dairy Barn.
- 17. All Bulls except calves must have rings in their noses and be tied by two means by their nose and either a neck strap or a halter.
- 18. Blankets on cattle are to be removed at the request of the Superintendent.
- 19. Cows 42 months old or older **must have produced** a calf carried to maturity within the past 18 months of the opening date of the Fair.
- 20. All livestock pens and stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily. No bedding will be allowed over the asphalt walkways. Aisle-ways must be kept clean and presentable.
- 21. No hay that requires forklift assistance to unload or move will be allowed because of safety issues.
- 22. The Western Idaho Fair has a no straw policy.
- 23. The **Milking Parlor** will be available for use as needed by the exhibitors in cooperation with the Dairy Superintendent. Exhibitors are urged to utilize the **Milking Parlor** facility so that the milk can be handled in the most efficient manner. No one under 9 years of age will be allowed in the milking parlor.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All cattle must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All sexually intact dairy-breed cattle, regardless of sex or age, must possess one of the following forms of official identification: USDA silver metal tag (Brite tag); USDA orange metal Bang's tag (females only); or RFID (radio-frequency identification) 840 tag. Cattle originating from in-state locations must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) dated no earlier than 30 days, that verifies general soundness and good health.

Out-of-state cattle shall meet all Idaho livestock import requirements set forth in IDAPA 02.04.21, Rules Governing the Importation of Animals, prior to entry into Idaho. <u>All cattle</u> require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days prior to entry into Idaho and must possess official individual identification, as stated above. **Vaccination/Testing Requirements:** <u>Non-brucellosis-vaccinated females</u> may enter into Idaho for the purpose of show or exhibition only, but require an Entry Permit. Cattle of dairy breeds, six (6) months of age and older, are exempt from tuberculosis testing if entering Idaho for the purpose of participating in shows or exhibitions, but also require an Entry Permit. Entry permits are also required for all intact dairy cattle. **Entry Permits:** Livestock entry permits must be obtained by the exhibitors attending veterinarian no greater than 72 hours prior to entry, via the online ISDA entry permit system or via phone @ 208.332.8540.

Out-of-state bulls, imported for exhibition at livestock shows are not required to be tested for Trichomoniasis, provided they will be returned to state of origin, will not be exposed to female cattle, and will not be offered for sale. All intact male and female cattle over eighteen (18) months of age coming from the Designated Surveillance Areas of Montana and Wyoming shall be officially individual identified and must have a negative brucellosis test within thirty (30) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho. All cattle are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

All cattle for breeding or for sale purposes at the Fair, must meet the Idaho change-of-ownership requirements. See "IDAPA 11.02.01 Rules of the Idaho Brand Board", which can be found at: http://adminrules.idaho.gov/rules/current/11/0201.pdf.

Dairy Cattle are allowed no more than 3 premiums per class unless otherwise listed in the class.

- 1. Bull Calf born after Aug. 2022 and over 4 months old
- 2. Yearling Bull born after Aug. 2021 and before Sept. 2022
- 3. Grand Champion Bull Reserve Champion Bull
- 4. Spring Heifer Calf, born in March 2023 or later and over 4 months of age
- 5. Winter Heifer Calf, born after Nov. 2022 and before March 2023
- 6. Fall Heifer Calf, born after Aug. 2022 and before Dec. 2022
- 7. Summer Yearling Heifer, born after May 2022 and before Sept. 2022
- 8. Spring Yearling Heifer, born after Feb. 2022 and before June 2022
- 9. Winter Yearling Heifer, born after Nov. 2021 and before March 2022
- 10. Fall Yearling Heifer, born after Aug. 2021 and before Dec. 2021. Not in milk (Fall Yearlings that have freshened, shown in 2-yr. old class).
- 11. Junior Champion Female (Winners of classes 4 thru 10) Reserve Junior Champion Female
- 13. Junior two-year old cow, born after Feb. 2021 and before Sept. 2021
- 14. Senior two-year old cow, born after Aug. 2020 and before March 2021
- 15. Junior three-year old cow, born after Feb. 2020 and before Sept. 2020
- 16. Senior three-year old cow, born after Aug. 2019 and before March 2020
- 17. Intermediate Champion (Winners of classes 13 thru 16) Reserve Intermediate Champion
- 18. Cow, 4 year-old, born after Aug. 2018 and before Sept. 2019
- 19. Cow, 5 year-old, born after Aug. 2017 and before Sept. 2018
- 20. Aged Cow, 6 years or over, born before Sept. 2017

- 26. Best Three Females All must be bred and owned by exhibitor. At least one must be 2 years of age or older. Each exhibitor limited to one entry......\$70-\$65-\$55-\$45-\$35
- 27. Produce of Dam Group to consist of 2 animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Each group is limited to one group from the same dam. Both animals need not be owned by exhibitor.

 28. Dam & Progeny Group to consist of 2 animals, a dam and offspring of any age and either sex. The dam must be named. Both animals need not be owned by exhibitor.

Three females all bred and owned by the exhibitor, consists of 2 animals over 2 years of age and 1 animal under 2 years of age. Exhibitor limited to one (1) entry per breed. <u>Competition following the Saturday Breed Show</u>.

- Premiums.......\$250 \$200 \$175 \$150 \$125 \$100 \$75 30. Premier Breeder Award. This award to be made to the breeder winning the most money in the individual classes, on the top eight (8) animals bred by him and exhibited by him or others. (No more than two (2) bulls can be included in the eight.) Best uddered cow class is not included........Banner
- 31. Premier Exhibitor Award. This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most money in the individual classes, on the top eight (8) animals owned and exhibited by him. No more than two (2) bulls can be included in the eight. Best uddered cow class is not included......Banner

Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Awards will be given only when there is competition between two or more exhibitors.

Reserve Champion – Competition for Reserve Champion in both sexes shall include the animal winning second place in the individual class which furnished the Grand Champion in addition to first place winners in all other classes.

SPECIAL AWARDS SUPREME CHAMPION COW AWARD

The Western Idaho Fair will award a Buckle to the winner. The Grand Champion Cow of each breed will compete for this award following the Saturday Breed Show. Judge's discretion will be used for the milk out rule.

GUERNSEY AWARDS

Lincrest Farms will award a trophy to the Grand Champion Female.

The Rolley Lincoln Memorial Plaque will be awarded to the Junior Champion Guernsey Female, sponsored by the Ankenman Family and Ankagem Farm.

The Western Idaho Fair will award a special **Barn Prize** of \$50 to the Exhibitor with the best-kept and decorated stall area and best-cleaned aisle.
