- 3. **PREMIUM PAY-OUT:** Awards will be available at the Premium Office. Copy of Exhibitor's number form should be presented for premium pay-out. Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 23 through Aug. 27 from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 28 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Aug. 29 through Sept. 8, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend, including the Friday prior to Labor Day. Awards not claimed by Sept. 8, 2023 will be considered a donation and will revert back to The Western Idaho Fair general fund.
