General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock – 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to this specific project. Unless otherwise stated, the term “horse” shall include horse, pony, mule, donkey and foal.

Rules & Regulations:

All 4-H horse fair entries are **due online by July 31st**. Entry sheets are to be completed by the leader of the club and submitted according to the age of the member. Forms not properly signed will be returned. Signed and completed 4-H Horse Project Record books are to be brought to the Interview Evaluation Day (**Saturday, August 9**). Youth presenting incomplete record books will not be interviewed nor be eligible to show at The Western Idaho Fair. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

1. Fair Participation: All 4-H and FFA horse exhibitors must comply with The Western Idaho Fair guidelines and adhere to all 4-H and FFA Policies

2. Helmet Requirement: Riders must wear an ASTM-SEI-approved equestrian helmet whenever mounted or driving a horse-drawn vehicle. Exhibitors wearing helmets in Halter and Showmanship classes shall not be discriminated against.

3. Boots & Safety Gear: Closed-toe boots must be worn when handling horses, including washing, grooming, and leading. This includes adults and leaders.

4. Horse Management: Exhibitors must have managed their project horse since **May 1st** of the current year. Any exceptions must be approved through a hardship petition at least 24 hours before the fair. Hardship forms may be obtained from the Ada County Extension Office and must be filled out.

5. Horse Ownership Rule: A horse may only be shown in **either 4-H or FFA**. 4-H and FFA members may show a maximum of two (2) horse projects at the WIF. Mare and foal are one project. Exhibitors showing in both FFA, and 4-H must have a different horse for each. Exhibitors may show one (1) 4-H horse and one (1) FFA horse in the same class.

6. Horse Age & Foal Participation: A horse's age is determined based on its birth date as of **January 1st** of the current year. Stud colts under **one year of age** may be shown. Exhibitors with a mare and foal project must ensure that the foal remains in its stall during all classes except designated foal classes. The mare must also be stalled during the foal's class, except during interview evaluations.

7. Showmanship Requirement: All exhibitors must

participate in a showmanship class with their project horse. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from high-point awards and premiums, but exhibitors may still audit entered classes. (Participate without being judged).

8. Novice Exhibitors: 4-H Novice exhibitors enter only Novice classes except for Halter Quality, Miniature, and Gymkhana (walk/trot ONLY), Driving and Costume classes.

9. Project Completion: 4-H horse project members must complete a **horse interview evaluation** on **August 9th** to be eligible to enter the fair. FFA exhibitors must complete a **horsemanship evaluation** and submit **three (3) written project goals**. Proper attire and tack must be worn for all evaluations.

10. Veterinary Check: All horses must be examined upon arrival to ensure they are sound and free from contagious diseases. All horses must pass a veterinary inspection on **August 14th from 5:00 – 7:00 P.M.** at The Western Idaho Fair before entering stalls. West Nile Virus vaccinations and a Coggins test are recommended. Horses must remain on-site until officially released by a supervisor.

11. Proper Horse Handling: Horses may not be left tied in stalls or left with tack on. Only the exhibitors may ride their project horse on fairgrounds. Horses are to carry only saddles, and/or one rider while on fairgrounds. Do not pack horses with materials. Please use wheelbarrows or carts.

12. Stall Assignments: Horses must be assigned a stall and be properly cared for by the exhibitor. All stalls must be cleaned daily.

13. Equipment Rules: All tack and equipment must comply with Ada County 4-H Horse Member's Guide & Rule Book and Pacific Northwest (PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide PNW 574 October 2023 Edition) rules.

14. Class Limitations: Each horse can only be shown in a class once, unless it is a designated 50-50 project shared by two members.

15. Versatility Ranch Classes: Participants in versatility ranch classes cannot enter novice classes.

16. Gymkhana: The Gymkhana events will be governed by the most currently revised Ada County 4-H Horse Member's Guide and Rule Book PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide PNW 574 October 2023 Edition. Equipment restrictions may be waived for Gymkhana classes. Exceptions and decisions shall be settled by the Horse Division Supervisors.

17. Breed Awards: Awards will be determined based on entry numbers, requiring at least three (3) entries for a breed class to be recognized.

18. Mini Horses: Mini horses (under 38 inches at the withers) will be shown as horses in all classes not specified as mini classes.

19. Tack & Attire: All riders must adhere to appropriate tack and attire guidelines per discipline (Western, English, or Gymkhana). Tack and Equipment Rules will be governed by the Ada County 4-H Horse Member's Guide & Rule Book and PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide PNW 574 October 2023 Edition.

20. Judges' Decisions: All judge decisions are final. Any interference with judging may result in disqualification. Classes may be divided so that no more than thirty (30) entries will show at one time. Classes may be combined at

the discretion of the Horse Division Supervisors. At the discretion of the judge, FFA and English Riders may be excused from wearing jackets in favor of long-sleeve shirts (in accordance with FFA or English attire rules).

21. Horse Transportation: It is recommended that horses transported on public roads must have either a brand inspection and/or a trip permit.

22. Herdsmanship Requirement: Horse exhibitors must follow herdsman's guidelines and are eligible for the educational display contest.

23. Horse Welfare: Horses must be provided with proper nutrition, hydration, and care at all times.

24. Parent & Guardian Responsibility: Parents and guardians must ensure that youth exhibitors comply with fair rules and maintain proper horse care.

25. Show Ring Conduct: Exhibitors must demonstrate good sportsmanship and respect judges, fellow competitors, and fair staff.

26. Prohibited Behavior: Any mistreatment of horses will result in immediate removal from the fair and possible future disqualification.

27. Horse Substitution Policy: No horse substitutions will be allowed after the entry deadline unless approved for hardship cases.

28. Show Schedule Adherence: Exhibitors must arrive on time for scheduled classes. Late arrivals may not be allowed to participate.

29. Stall Decorations: Decorations must be safe for horses and comply with fair regulations.

30. Fairground Access: Horses may not be ridden outside of designated areas.

31. Costume Class: Costumes must not block the horse's vision or movement. Supervisors may remove any horse deemed unsafe.

32. Educational Clinics: Participants are encouraged to attend clinics to enhance their horsemanship skills.

33. Rule Compliance: Exhibitors who fail to follow these rules may be subject to penalties, including disqualification.

34. Safety Authority: Horse division supervisors have the final decision on all matters related to rider and horse safety.

Stalls:

Horses stalled overnight at the fair will stay the five (5) days. Stalls need to be cleaned daily by 10:00 am and waters refilled.

Transport **trailers will not be unhitched from the tow vehicle**, will be unloaded promptly, and then moved outside of the gate. **TRAILERS IN VIOLATION WILL BE TOWED.** Pre-designated tack trailers will be unhitched in pre-designated areas. Horses and trailers may be moved from the grounds on Monday, August 18 between 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 pm if they are not staying for Gymkhana events. Stall decorations may not be taken down before 10 pm on Monday night.

On Tuesday, August 19, trucks, trailers, and horses must be removed by 10:00 a.m. Exhibitors will clean their own stalls, and the **stalls will be inspected by a Horse Division Supervisor** 1) before the horse leaves the grounds and 2) before premium money will be released. Questions will be addressed to a Horse Supervisor.

Premiums (prize money): (Exhibitor shall be eligible for only 1 premium in any one class)

Showmanship - \$5.00 Blue, \$4.00 Red, \$3.00 White as well 1st Blue, 2nd Red, 3rd White – Rosettes respectively for the top 3 in FFA and each 4-H age division. **No premiums** will be paid on the following: Rosettes for showmanship, Danish ribbons for interview evaluations, record books, Gymkhana events, beginner horse classes, or champion classes.
All other classes will be grouped Blue, Red, and White. Danish premiums will be paid - \$5.00, \$4.00, \$3.00, respectively.

Ribbons:

Awards will be made on merit as determined by the judge considering type, condition, and showmanship.

All exhibits will be judged by the modified Danish System. Showmanship – Blue ribbon exhibitors ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class will receive a Blue, Red or White Rosette respectively.

Ribbons will be given to the first six (6) places in all classes except Beginning Horse (1st or 2nd year). Ribbons will be given in Gymkhana events to six (6) places. No premiums will be paid on any placement ribbons except showmanship.

High Point:

High Point and Reserve High Point awards are based on the points earned by placings in classes. See the Ada County 4-H Horse Member's Guide and Rule Book for scoring details. Halter Quality points DO NOT count toward high point performance awards. All high point awards are final as announced. Results cannot be changed for any reason. Those contesting high point awards will be considered in violation of the Code of Conduct.

Age Divisions:

For Performance Classes - Performance classes shall be defined as any class other than Halter Quality and driving classes. Classes to be determined by 4-H member's age as follows:

Western, English & Trail Classes:

1. FFA - All ages together in Senior level classes or pattern
2. Senior 4-H (14-18)
3. Intermediate 4-H (11-13)
4. Junior 4-H (8-10)

Classes will be shown in the order listed above. At the Horse Council Fair committee's discretion, age divisions may be split if they are determined to be too big for safety or show management reasons.

1. Novice 11 & up Walk/Trot
2. Novice 10 & under Walk/Trot
