ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 1. Entries must be postmarked by this date. Any late entries are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent. You may submit your entries online. Online deadline is Aug. 4. Payment must be made with entry. Only Visa and MasterCard accepted online. www.idahofair.com.

 The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled in and must include the name and registration number of all animals entered and the names and registration numbers of both sire and dam.

Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but no Exhibitor will be allowed more than three premiums in any one individual class or two premiums in any group classes.

2. **FEES:** An entry fee of \$12.00 per head will be charged. (\$24.00 per head if late entry accepted.), except:

Texas Longhorn: An entry fee of \$40.00 per class will be charged (\$52.00 if late entry accepted.)

No refunds on entry fees.

- 3. PASSES: Each exhibitor may purchase two exhibitor tickets for personal use at a cost of \$20.00 each. A helper's pass may be purchased for \$20.00 for every two animals entered. Remittance for entry fees and exhibitor passes must accompany entries.
- 4. **PARKING:** Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. For more information see General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.
- 5. CAMPING: See General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules.

6. **ARRIVAL:** Angus, Hereford & Murray Grey exhibits may arrive Wednesday, Aug. 14, after 8:00 a.m. and must be in place by 6:00 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 15. Other Beef Breed exhibitors may arrive after 6:00 a.m. Wednesday, Aug. 20 and must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. that day.

8. **RELEASE:** Angus, Hereford & Murray Grey will be released at 10:00 p.m., Monday, Aug. 18, and must be out of the barn by 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 19.

Other Breeds must remain in place until 8:00 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 24. All exhibitors must possess a "release slip" from the department Superintendent for transportation of livestock from the grounds.

Exhibitors leaving early without the permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all awards due them.

- Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the Rules and Regulations in front of this Premium Book and/or Website.
- 10. All animals entered for competition must be owned or coowned by the exhibitor. Registration certificates must accompany all animals and be presented prior to judging. Registration certificates must be in the name of the owner or co-owner. Any transfer of animals must have been made prior to the Fair and the registration certificate must indicate the name of the current owner. Registration papers will be checked by the breed representative or his agent prior to judging.
- 11. Substitutions will be allowed up to 24 hours prior to judging. Substitutions will be allowed on a 1 for 1 basis within the same breed and must be of the same sex.
 - Ringside entry of single animals is prohibited. Any animal substituted must have current registration certificate and meet requirements set forth in Rule # 10 above.
- Stalls will be assigned prior to the Fair by Western Idaho Fair personnel.
- 13. Prior to judging, the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted due to a clerical error, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office for a change to be made.
- 14. The Management of the Fair reserves the right to refuse admittance or remove from the Fairgrounds all unmanageable animals that may endanger public safety.
- 15. All animals, except calves, must have an extra neck rope. BULLS, yearlings and older, must be shown with nose tongs. No nurse cows stalled in the barn.
- 16. Livestock pens and stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily.
- 17. Electrical power in the livestock barn is limited. Exhibitors are permitted to bring generators if they desire.
- 18. There will be a designated area outside of the Livestock Barn where "blocking chutes" may be placed.
- 19. TIE-OUTS: Exhibitors using tie-out areas at night can take animals out of the barn after 9:00 p.m. Night tie-out area is limited. Tie-out area must have manure removed and pavement swept each a.m.
- 20. There will be an exhibitor's meeting held for each section of the Fair. The Superintendent will announce the time and place.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All cattle must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All sexually intact beef-breed cattle over 12 months of age must possess one of the following forms of official identification: USDA silver metal tag (Brite tag); USDA orange metal Bang's tag (females only); or RFID (radio-frequency identification) 840 tag. Cattle originating from in-state locations must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) dated no earlier than 30 days, that verifies general soundness and good health.

Out-of-state cattle shall meet all Idaho livestock import requirements set forth in IDAPA 02.04.21, Rules Governing the Importation of Animals, prior to entry into Idaho. All cattle require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days prior to entry into Idaho and must possess official individual identification, as stated above. Vaccination/Testing Requirements: Non-brucellosis-vaccinated females may enter into Idaho for the purpose of show or exhibition only but require an Entry Permit. Entry permits are required for all intact beef

bulls. **Entry Permits:** Livestock entry permits must be obtained by the exhibitors attending veterinarian no greater than 72 hours prior to entry, via the online ISDA entry permit system or via phone @ 208.332.8540.

Out-of-state bulls, imported for exhibition at livestock shows are not required to be tested for Trichomoniasis, provided they will be returned to state of origin, will not be exposed to female cattle, and will not be offered for sale. All intact male and female cattle over eighteen (18) months of age coming from the Designated Surveillance Areas of Montana and Wyoming shall be officially individual identified and must have a negative brucellosis test within thirty (30) days prior to entry into the State of Idaho. All cattle are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

All cattle for breeding or for sale purposes at the Fair, must meet the Idaho change-of-ownership requirements. See "IDAPA 11.02.01 Rules of the Idaho Brand Board", which can be found at: http://adminrules.idaho.gov/rules/current/11/0201.pdf.

Idaho State Group Classes are offered after a breed has reached thirty-one (31) head or more through the show ring and will be discontinued if a breed falls below that number for two consecutive years.

Cow/Calf Pair will be counted as One Head in reaching the 31 head through the show ring.

Exhibitors: All exhibitors showing breeding animals in a Junior Show must be age 8 (Hereford: 7) by January 1 of the current year and no more than age 21 by January 1 of the current year. Exhibitors must also be current/paid junior members of the parent Association of their respective breed by entry deadline.

If an exhibitor wants to show a steer in the Angus Steer Show, they must be entered by entry deadline and be a paid member of the Idaho Junior Angus Association by show day.

Contact the Junior Advisor(s) listed above for more details or information about membership.

Registration certificates for breeding animals must list the junior exhibitor as sole owner (no co-ownership allowed) and dated at least 30 days prior to entry deadline.

Transfer and registration deadline is 30 days prior to show day. For the **Angus** Bred & Owned Division, the junior exhibitor must be listed on the registration paper as both the breeder and first owner of the animal.

Guidelines and Rules: The Junior Angus Show at the Western Idaho Fair is first and foremost governed by all printed and implied rules and guidelines listed in the Idaho Junior Angus Association Handbook and second by those listed in the Western Idaho Fair Exhibitor's Handbook. Non-Angus entries are governed solely by the Western Idaho Fair Exhibitor's Handbook. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have a copy of both books prior to the show and to be aware of the contents of both.

All participating exhibitors agree to abide by said rules and guidelines and exhibit good sportsmanship. Violations can result in forfeiture of premiums, expulsion from the junior show and/or removal from the fairgrounds. Information about and authority to enforce said guidelines and rules for the Junior Show is the responsibility of (but not limited to) the Junior Advisor(s), Junior Show Chair(s), and the Western Idaho Fair Beef Superintendent(s).

Breeding Entries: A Junior Entry form is required to enter the Junior Show. There is no additional stall fee or entry fee for junior **breeding** entries if the same animal has also been entered in the Open Breed Show where a fee is required.

If the animal(s) are not entered in the Open Breed Show, then a \$12.00 fee must accompany the Junior entry form. Junior (and Open) entry forms may be found in this Premium Book and online at www.idahofair.com or you can stop by the Premium Office to pick one up.

Check-In: All cattle must have legible tattoo corresponding with the registration certificate for that animal. All cattle (both Junior and Open entries) must be accompanied at check-in by a copy of the original registration certificate. At check-in representatives of the respective Association will verify the registration certificates and tattoo numbers of all animals entered for both the Junior and Open shows. Missing or illegible tattoos or missing registration certificates could result in the animal not showing in either show. Any registration certificates not listing the junior member as sole owner will result in the animal not showing in the Breed Junior Show, though they may still be eligible to show in the Open Breed Show and Junior Showmanship Classes.

The Western Idaho Fair will contribute \$500 to the Junior Shows in form of premiums.

DIVISION 10 – JUNIOR ANGUS Saturday August 16 – 9:00 a.m.

Angus Steer Show: You must first see "Class 57: Angus Steer" to see if your animal is eligible to participate in the Junior Angus Steer Show. If the animal is eligible, you must send in your completed Junior Angus Entry form with the \$12.00 entry fee by entry deadline. You cannot enter on show day. You must also provide verification at check-in deadline that your steer is at least 50% Angus. You must still submit the \$12.00 entry fee even if you are stalling your steer in the 4-H or FFA stall areas and not in the Angus stall area. Exhibitor must show their own animal.

Angus Awards: Idaho Angus Association, Idaho Junior Association, Boise Valley Angus Club, individual breeders, and local business.

Premiums will be paid by the Idaho Junior Angus Show Chair and/or the Idaho Junior Angus Advisor. Amounts will vary depending on outside donations.

Classes: Individual classes will be determined after entries close. Remember that all cattle must be registered solely in the exhibitor's name at least 30 days prior to show day.

Only **registered Angus** cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown. Champion and Reserve Champion placings are not counted in number of head shown.

Junior Angus Classes:

Breeding Classes: Use class numbers from the Angus Open Show (No Idaho State Classes).

Junior Angus Steer Class:

57. Steers must be owned by the exhibitor but do not have to be registered Angus. To show in the Junior Angus Show, a steer must be at least 50% Angus with an Angus dam or an Angus sire. Steers must be predominately black hided, predominately black haired, no long ear, no hump & no scurs. No feeder size steers.

Showmanship: Exhibitors wishing to participate in the Idaho Junior Showmanship Contest are not required to pay an additional fee if they have also entered a breeding animal in the Junior Show.

They may use their own breeding animal, or they can borrow a breeding animal that is entered in either the Junior or Open Shows to show in the ring. (No steers are allowed in showmanship.) All divisions are based on the exhibitor's age as of Jan. 1 of the current year. The judge will place a Grand

and a Reserve winner in each division and may place more exhibitors if they so choose.

Animals entered in the junior show may be either solely owned by the individual junior exhibitor or leased by them from a current owner of registered AMGA animals. Only the leasing junior exhibitor can register these animals for the open show classes. Junior AMGA member must be a member with AMGA by the registration deadline of the fair in order to show in the junior show.

Breeding Classes: Use class numbers from the Murray Grey Open Show.

Showmanship Classes:

Deadline for registration for showmanship classes is 9:00 a.m. the day of the Junior AMGA show. Any AMGA Junior member may compete in the showmanship class without having animals registered in the breeding classes. They may 'borrow', with permission of the breeder, any animal owned by any AMGA member already registered in the open classes to compete in their showmanship class.

- 55. Peewee Division. Exhibitor must be less than 9 years of age.
- 56. Junior Division. Exhibitor must be 9 -13 years of age.
- 57. Intermediate Div. Exhibitor must be 14 16 years of age.

<u>DIVISION 1 – ABERDEEN ANGUS</u>

Note: Angus Exhibitors - Please read all preceding rules and regulations in this department, as they pertain to all beef breeds.

> Saturday, Aug. 16 – 10:00 a.m. Junior Show: Saturday, Aug. 16 – 9:00 a.m.

All animals must be registered with the American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri 64506.

Check in: All Angus Cattle must be checked in by 6:00 p.m., Thursday, Aug 14.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up.

Any animal upon check-in that does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks, or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with calf at side: calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have proof of registration at check in.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2: Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules, Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such shows shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications is not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.

- 1. Cow/Calf Class: cows three (3) years of age and younger, cows born Jan. 2022 through Aug. 2023. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be born Nov. 10, 2024, or after. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class. (See note on page 12)
- 2. Cow/Calf Class: cows four (4) years of age and older, cows must be born Dec. 31, 2021, or earlier. Calf must be the cow's most recent calf and be born Nov. 10, 2024, or after.

Cattle bred and owned by a junior member(s) may be included if the exhibitor of the breeders six head is an individual or married couple and is the parent or legal guardian of the junior member(s).

IDAHO STATE GROUP CLASSES - The following classes are reserved for Idaho Breeders only. All animals entered must have already been shown in individual classes in today's

- 57. Pair of Calves: One bull and one female, born in current year, and must be owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
- 58. Pair of Females: Two females, owned or co-owned by
- 59. Pair of Bulls: Two bulls, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
- 60. Progeny of Dam: Two animals, either same or different sex, embryo transplant or natural, owned, or co-owned by
- 61. Best Pair: One bull and one female, owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
- 62. Exhibitor's Five Head: Both sexes represented, owned or coowned by exhibitor.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR: This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most money in the individual classes on the top eight (8) animals owned and exhibited by him.

NOTE: Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor. This award will be given only when there is competition between two or more exhibitors.

All animals must be registered in the records of the American Shorthorn Association (ASA), 7607 NW Prairie View Rd. Kansas City, MO 64151 at the time of the Show.

ShorthornPlus animals must be registered 50% Shorthorn to qualify for the ShorthornPlus Division.

Animals entered in an ASA sponsored Junior Show may only be in the sole name of the individual junior exhibitor and must be exhibited by the owner. Junior eligibility is from age 7-22.

ASA will accept electronic registration papers for check-in.

All Shorthorn & ShorthornPlus are subject to a tattoo inspection, parentage DNA testing, an age inspection and/or females 20 months of age on day of show are subject to a blood test to prove pregnancy if deemed necessary by the ASA. The decision of an examining veterinarian is final.

Females 20 months of age on the day of the show need to have a pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show. If verification cannot be produced upon request, the exhibitor is allowed to find a qualified veterinarian to verify pregnancy prior to the time of show.

Senior Yearling Females who have calved will show based on age. The exhibitor can exhibit the female with or without the calf at side. If a Purebred Female has a ShorthornPlus calf at side, it is not eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show, however it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus Show.

Females entered in a cow/calf class must have a natural born calf at side that does not exceed 280 days of age on show day and the calf must be registered with the ASA. If a Purebred Female has a ShorthornPlus calf at side, it is <u>not</u> eligible for the Purebred Shorthorn Show, however it is eligible for the ShorthornPlus show. All calves showing alongside a cow must be a registered animal with ASA.

<u>IMPORTANT:</u> Each of the following classes MAY be broken into multiple classes to accommodate large numbers of entries, but separate classes MAY NOT be combined into one. For example, there MAY be four "Junior Heifer Calf" classes, but there MAY NOT be one single "Spring Heifer Calf" class (combining Late and Early Spring calves).
