How to enter - It is simple and easy and early!

Bring in your entries with the entry form(s) to the Fairgrounds on Wednesday, Aug. 13 from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. or on Thursday, Aug. 14 from 7:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. Sorry, late entries cannot be accepted due to time constraints.

Only entry day for Container Grown Plants (Divisions 16-20) on Wednesday, Aug. 13, from 11:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

All other divisions (<u>Designs: Divisions 1 – 7 and Horticulture: Divisions 8-15</u>) Wednesday or Thursday; for times see above.

Entries will be taken in the North Expo Building.

If you want to enter early and reduce time spent in line on entry days, you have the following 2 options:

- 1. a) Mail or deliver ONLY your entry form(s) to the Premium Office, 5610 Glenwood, Boise ID 83714 by August 5.
  - b) Bring your Container Grown Plants (Divisions 16-20) entries on Aug. 13 from 11:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m.
  - c) Bring in all other entries (Designs & Horticulture) on August 13 from 11:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m. or Aug. 14 from 7:00 11:00 a.m.
- OR 2. a) Enter online by Aug. 5 at <a href="www.idahofair.com">www.idahofair.com</a>. Follow the link to Competitive Exhibits. The Western Idaho Fair will cover the \$2 convenience fee. There will be no charge to enter online unless a professional fee applies.
  - b) Bring your Container Grown Plants (Divisions 16-20) entries on Aug. 13 from 11:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m.
- c) Bring in all other entries (**Designs & Horticulture**) on **August 13** from 11:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m. <u>or</u> **Aug. 14** from 7:00 11:00 a.m. Tips for Success:
- Do not bring heirloom, sentimental or other irreplaceable items as part of your entry. We cannot guarantee the item's safe return.
- Select and cut multiples of your entry the day before and let them "drink" overnight. Bring and enter the best of the best!
- Make sure there is no foliage below the waterline prior to submitting your entry (this counts for judging!).
- Be early! Late entries cannot be accepted due to conflicting scheduling with judging.
- Complete your entry forms at home. Entry forms are available at The Western Idaho Fair Premium Office or on <a href="www.idahofair.com">www.idahofair.com</a>.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

All divisions (except Division 7) in the Flower Department are open to amateur gardeners only. AMATEUR is anyone who does not derive their livelihood from the sale of flowers, plants, or floral designs. Each exhibitor is allowed one entry per class, unless otherwise noted.

Division 7 – PROFESSIONAL DESIGNS is open to floral professionals only. For this division, a PROFESSIONAL is anyone who works in the floral profession or otherwise derives a portion of their livelihood from the teaching of floral design or sale of flower arrangements. Each exhibitor is allowed one entry per class; an entry fee of \$3.00 will be charged for each entry in the professional division.

#### **ENTRY AND PARKING**

- Location Department 13 Flowers is located in the North Expo Building. The entry area is on the Northeast end of the building on the grassy area where tables are set up.
- Parking During entry, parking is free. Vehicles can be parked for a few minutes in the area marked with LOADING ZONE signs to be quickly off-loaded on the outdoor tables provided. Afterwards, please move your vehicle to any of the available marked parking areas.
- Entry Prep
  - Place your Horticulture entries into the available containers.
  - Entry Form Complete your entry form if not previously done.

- Be sure to compare your prepared entry form with your final entry specimen(s).
- Change anything needed on the entry form to make sure your entry(s) specimens and entry form match! This is very important. If you have questions, please ask any of the Flower Department clerks.

Example: You complete your entry form at home prior to entry day with the following items: a design, a dahlia, a delphinium, a rose, and a container grown plant. On your way to enter, the delphinium breaks, and you are not going to enter it. Simply line through this item on your entry form, obtain tags and enter your remaining items.

#### Exhibitor Number

 If you don't have an exhibitor number (you have not entered anything in any other department this year) go to the table marked EXHIBITOR #s.

#### Entry Tags

- Pre-entered but don't yet have tags? Go to the Flower Department in the Expo building and stop at the table marked ENTRY TAGS to pick them up.
- <u>Didn't pre-enter?</u> Take your completed, accurate entry form to the Flower Department in the Expo building and stop at the table marked ENTRY TAGS.
- Have your entry tags? Return to the outside tables and place the corresponding tag with each entry item.
- <u>Left over tags?</u> If you do not use all your tags, please give the unused tags to the Flower Department clerk at the ENTRY CHECK-IN table.
- Entry Check-in & Placement By 11:00 a.m., take all your tagged entry items into the Flower Department, to the table marked ENTRY CHECK-IN and the clerk will check your items and direct you to the appropriate placement clerks. Please do not leave until all your entries have been accepted for placement. All entries must be checked in by 11:00 a.m.

#### **JUDGING ALL ENTRIES**

If an exhibit does not merit an Award, none will be given though it may be the only entry in that class. Decision of the Judges is final, and all entries must be considered by the Judges.

Exhibit area will be closed to the public for judging beginning at 2:00 p.m. Thursday, August 14.

Floral staff shall have the right to remove any unsightly design or horticulture. Precautions will be taken to ensure the safety of all exhibits and in no case will The Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendents be responsible for loss or injury of the same.

#### PREMIUM PAY-OUT

Awards will be available at the Premium Office. Copy of Exhibitor Number Form should be presented for Premium pay-out. Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 20 through Aug. 24 from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 25 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Aug. 26 through Sept. 5, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend, including the Friday prior to Labor Day. Awards not claimed by Sept. 5, 2025, will be considered a donation and will revert back to The Western Idaho Fair general fund.

#### RELEASE

Monday, Aug. 25 – 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. In no case may exhibits be removed before 10:00 a.m. Monday, Aug. 25. The Floral staff must check out all exhibits. Exhibits which are not claimed within one week after the close of the Fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the Manager of the Fair sees fit.

#### **DESIGNS**

- All designs must be the work of the exhibitor but not necessarily grown by exhibitor unless otherwise specified in the class description.
- All designs entries must be less than 24" wide, except where otherwise specified. Designs should occupy a visually pleasing proportion of the allotted space.
- Artificial, treated or dyed fresh plant material (including flowers, fruits, vegetables, and foliage) are not permitted in designs.
- Fruits and vegetables that are cut open are not acceptable.
- American flag(s) or other national flag(s) may not be used.
- No live animals are to be used in any class.
- Feathers may be used except for endangered or prohibited species.
- Accessories may be used in all design classes. If possible, put your name on the bottom of all your design pieces.
- Winning a Best of Division award in the Novice or Intermediate divisions does not automatically move you to the next level. Your design division level is based on the number of **blue ribbons** won for floral designs in previous fairs and flower shows.
- Fair will not be responsible for lost, damaged, broken, or stolen containers, accessories or any article included in or with a design entry.
- All entrants must include a note card listing the flower/plant material used is the design. Cards are available from the design placement clerk, if needed.

Card should accompany the entry tag.

#### **HORTICULTURE**

- Horticulture must be grown by the exhibitor and must have been in their possession for a minimum of three months.
- Cut horticulture must be displayed in <u>clear plastic</u> vases.
   Every effort will be made to provide entrants with a Fair display vase for each entry; however, depending upon the number of entries this cannot be guaranteed.
- Preservative will be used by Fair Staff to keep containers clean and to preserve the cut flowers.
- If the entrant provides the container and wishes to have the container returned, please be sure to securely attach return information to the container. The Fair will not be responsible for lost or damaged containers. Please note: the container is not part of the judging criteria for Horticulture (Divisions 8-15).
- Judges consider the stem, cleanliness and freshness of foliage and flowers. Foliage must not be polished with oil or other preparation.
- Foliage must be left on all cut specimens, but not be under water
- Exhibitors should make sure to read this handbook for the correct number of stems needed in each class.
- Fresh flowers may be used to replace the original entry after several days, if needed.

One bloom per stem, disbudded (remove side buds). All classes are one bloom per stem, unless a Collection. Each dahlia cultivar should be entered in only one form/size/color class per the most current classification by the American Dahlia Society: https://dahlia.org/docsinfo/ocg/.

- Plants must be free of harmful insects/pests or disease.
- Entries of Container Grown Plants (Division 17 21) will be taken **ONLY** on Wednesday, August 13, from 11:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. Container Grown Plant entries will not be accepted on Thursday.
- Container grown plants exhibited any time in the last 3 years (2022-2024 Western Idaho Fairs) should not be entered this
- All entrants **must** include the following:
  - 1. A waterproof drain tray that is 1"-3" larger than the base of the container.
  - 2. A note card with watering instructions sufficient for the duration of the Fair printed on one side of the card. Cards are available from clerks at the PLACEMENT table, if needed.
  - 3. Plant identification (common name is sufficient) printed on the reverse side of the card.




