

ENTRY: Entries close Aug. 1. Entries must be postmarked by this date. Any late entries may be accepted up until Aug 8th and are subject to double entry fees and prior approval of the Superintendent. You may submit your entries online. Online deadline is Aug. 4. Payment must be made with entry. NOTE: <u>Online site will close down at midnight August 4th</u>.

- 1. The Management reserves the right to close entries whenever available space is filled. FIRST COME FIRST SERVE BASIS. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Western Idaho Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled out and include the name and breed of all animals entered along with age and registration number of Jacks where applicable. To delete or add classes for **animals already entered**, exhibitor must notify the Premium Office by 9:00 a.m., Aug. 15. **Ringside entries are prohibited.** Exhibitors may make as many entries in each class as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two premiums in any one class.**
- FEES: A stabling fee of \$12.00 per head will be charged. (\$24.00 per head if late, after Aug 4 and up to Aug. 8th.) \$5.00 per class for AMA Classes No extra fee for Non AMA Classes, marked by *** \$10 entry fee for Freestyle classes 63 & 64 and \$45 for the Cattle Classes per entry mule for classes 96-110. No refunds on entry fees.
- 3. **PASSES:** Exhibitors entering one or more animals may purchase two exhibitors passes, per day of the show, at a cost of \$5.00 each. Additional passes may be purchased for \$5.00 each per day for riders, handlers, etc. **Remittance for entry fees and exhibitors passes must accompany entries.**
- 4. PARKING: Livestock exhibitors will be issued two vehicle parking permits. For more information see General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules. Storage Pods will be available in the designated area south of Legg Arena to store tack, feed, equipment, etc. Because of limited space, livestock and horse trailers cannot be parked inside the Fairgrounds.
- 5. CAMPING: See General Rules and Information on page 4 or Website under General Rules. If choosing to dry camp onsite, there will be a designated marked off area for Mule & Donkey exhibitors only. Contracts with rules and regulations as well as release of liability to be signed before camping is allowed. See Superintendent for more info or email at wifmuleshow@gmail.com or call/text 208-859-4138. A

special camping pass may entry passes.

- 6. ARRIVAL: Mules and Donkeys may arrive Thursday evening Aug. 14, but must be on the grounds by 10:00 a.m. Friday, Aug. 15. Animals arriving after 10:00 a.m. will have to be led in from the Livestock Vehicle Parking Area. Vehicular movement is prohibited inside the admission gates while the Fair is open to the public.
- 7. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the Rules and Regulations in front of this Premium Book and/or Website.
- JUDGING SCHEDULE: All classes will be held in Legg (Trackside) Arena. Thursday, Aug. 14 – 7:30 p.m. Exhibitors Meeting
- Friday, Aug. 15 8:00 a.m. Exhibitors Meeting Friday, Aug. 15 – 9:00 a.m. Classes 1 – 64 Saturday, Aug. 16 – 9:00 a.m. Classes 65 – 110 Sunday, Aug. 17 – 9:00 a.m. Classes 111 – 166
- 9. RELEASE: Mules and Donkeys will be released Sunday, Aug. 17 at 10:30 p.m. or Monday, Aug. 18 before 10:00 a.m. All exhibitors must obtain a 'Release Slip' from the Department Superintendent for transportation of livestock off the grounds. This is for the safety of all animals. Violation of this rule will be cause to revoke premiums, forfeit entry fees and AMA points. <u>Vehicular</u> movement is allowed for Mule & Donkey Exhibitors after 11:00 p.m. on Sunday.
- 10. All animals shall be entered in the owner's name. The date of computing age will be January 1. No animals will be accepted for entry unless they are in show condition.
- 11. Date of computing age for youth exhibitors will be Jan. 1 of show year.
- 12. Prior to judging, the Superintendent will inspect all exhibits in the department to determine if they are entered in the class in which they should compete. In cases where it is obvious that entries are not correctly posted, the Superintendent must contact the Premium Office for a change to be made.



- 13. Anyone abusing their animal will be excused from all competition by Fair Management and/or the Judge.
- 14. All stalls are to be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. daily. Exhibitors must be prepared to care for animals all day. Exhibitors are responsible for care and security of their tack and equipment.
- 15. The Management reserves the right to reject, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entries and award prizes without claim for damages.
- 16. An exhibitor who violates any of the rules set forth in the Exhibitor Handbook will forfeit all privileges and premiums. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the General Rules and Regulations in the front of the Exhibitor Handbook or website. Entry is deemed acceptance of the Rules.

17. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Animals must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-ofstate animals must meet Idaho Department of Agriculture import requirements and be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary inspection dated no earlier than 30 days prior to arrival at the Western Idaho Fair.

For out-of-state Jacks, 12 months and older: the issuing veterinarian must write one of the four statements relative to Equine Viral Arteritis (EVA) "status" on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. These EVA status statements are found and defined in the Idaho State Department of Agriculture's Animal Import Rules IDAPA 02.04.21 and on the Idaho State Department of Agriculture's website https://agri.idaho.gov/main/animals/equine-services/equineimports/ [agri.idaho.gov]. Out-of-state animals will be required to have a valid (within the previous 12 months) Coggins (AGID or ELISA) test. All horses and mules should be vaccinated for infectious respiratory diseases transmitted animal-to-animal such as Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus at least 30 days prior to exhibition. A West Nile Virus Vaccination is not required, but recommended. WNV is transmitted only from bird to mosquito to animal (NOT animal to animal and NOT from animal to mosquito to animal). All animals are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds. Please contact your veterinarian to discuss appropriate vaccinations well in advance of the Fair.

SHOW RULES:

- 1. This show will follow the 2004-2026 American Mule Association (AMA) Rule book for all approved classes. Judges' opinion is final.
- 2. READ YOUR RULE BOOK. If you have questions, AMA Rule Rep will be available as well as superintendent.
- 3. Ring Steward controls all activity in the arena.
- 4. Judges' decisions are final. The judge may only be approached IF, he/she approaches you first, or you speak to ring steward, who will ask for permission.
- 5. IF YOU DQ you forfeit your "premiums" in that class.
- 6. Gate Holds must be requested prior to class. Gate holds maximum 5 minutes.
- 7. In the event of a tie for high point, the superintendent and show secretary have already before the show began, selected classes "for the tie breakers" per high point division. If you would like to know, please ask.
- 8. Patters will be posted Minimum 1 hour before each class.
- 9. ALL CLASSES unless stated will have premiums paid back after the show is complete mailed to you, 'unless' you didn't follow the rules correctly.

These are open classes. Animals are judged on conformation, quality, substance, way-of-going, refinement and condition. Your animals may be shown in action at a walk and trot and any other maneuvers at the request of the Judge. May be shown by Junior or Senior exhibitor. Judged 50% conformation, 20% way of going and soundness, 20% fitting and conditioning, and 10% appointments.

Judge's discretion due to degree of difficulty and correctness. A perfect short simple pattern will be scored over a higher degree of difficulty "pattern' if maneuvers are done incorrectly.

Saturday, August 16 – Cattle Classes \$45 Entry Fee/Mule/Class

Cattle Driving: Class is to be judged on the horse's natural cow ability, response to the rider's cues, and the rider's stockmanship. The objective is to drive a single cow through a lane and put it in a pen at the opposite end of the arena as if moving a cow in a stock yard. The class is evaluated as if the judge owns the cattle, and they are shipped to market. Excessive speed and stress as a result of the horse's or rider's methods equates to weight loss of the cattle and result in lower scores. Calm, quiet, and pragmatic work on the cow while demonstrating cow sense by the horse and stock sense by the rider is to be credited. Time limit to be determined. Ranch Herd Work: Judging will begin at the timeline. The contestant shall approach the herd with no hesitation, weaving or reluctance on the part of the horse to enter the herd sufficiently deep enough to show his ability to make a cut. The horse shall work quietly, but alertly, causing very little disturbance to the herd by a sufficient distance and setting up a cow while holding it in a working position as near the center of the arena as possible. The degree of difficulty, eye appeal and the amount of courage in staying on a tough cow will be taken into consideration. The amount of time actually spent working cattle in the 2-minute period will have a positive effect on the total score. The horse should show a great deal of expression but no ill will toward the animal. Judging will end at the whistle.

Ranch Roping – Breakaway Hondo! The idea of this class is to demonstrate the ability of the horse and rider's skill of roping a single cow as if they were doctoring injured or sick cattle. Cattle should be handled as calmly and slowly as possible. The judge should judge this class as if the cattle belonged to him or her. At no time should there be excessive running or disruption of the herd. Up to two loops (but no more that two) may be attempted within the 90 second time limit. The loop must go over the head of the intended cow, rope dallied, and honda split within 90 seconds to complete the roping task. For the Open and Non-Pro Divisions only: If the second loop thrown by a competitor catches an animal determined by the judge not to be the original animal targeted for the first throw, the score will be a 60 for the run. For the Novice and Youth Divisions only: A competitor who misses an animal with their first loop may target a different animal and receive a score if another loop within the time frame makes a legal catch.
