- 1. ENTRY: Entry days vary within this department. Please read carefully. Entries will be received in the North Wing of the Exposition Building. Entries must be made on forms supplied by The Western Idaho Fair. All entries must be signed by parent or guardian. Please indicate present age of exhibitor on entry forms. Only ONE entry per class will be accepted per exhibitor. No item previously entered in The Western Idaho Fair may be re-entered. Exhibitors are requested to carefully read the General Rules and Regulations of this Fair. Department Rules supersede General Rules. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of the exhibits, but the entrant assumes all responsibility in case of loss, theft, or damage and in no case will the Management of the Fair or the Superintendent be held responsible. Exhibits must have been made in the last 12 months.
- 2. **JUDGING:** Agriculture & Flower Divisions will be judged Aug. 14. Other Divisions will be judged Aug. 13.
- 3. PREMIUM PAY-OUT: Awards will be available at the Premium Office. Copy of Exhibitor's number form should be presented for premium pay-out. Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 20 through Aug. 24 from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 25 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Aug. 26 through Sept. 5, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend, including the Friday prior to Labor Day. Awards not claimed by Sept. 5, 2025, will be considered a donation and will revert back to The Western Idaho Fair general fund.
- 4. RELEASE: Monday, Aug. 25 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. In no case may exhibits be removed before 10:00 a.m. Monday, Aug. 25. Exhibits which are not claimed within one week after the close of the Fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the Fair Manager sees fit.

Exhibitors must present claim checks corresponding with entry tags when claiming exhibits. Exhibits must not be removed without the Superintendent or assistants being present to check out entries.

Bring two jars of canned product, one for display and one for taste. ALL CANNED FOODS must have been processed within the last 12 months and be sealed in standard canning jars with ring. No Paraffin seals on any entries. Judges reserve the right to open any jar if necessary, when judging. Each jar MUST BE NEATLY LABELED, giving name of product, date canned, type of pack (raw or hot pack), PROCESSING METHOD (boiling water canner or pressure canner), PROCESSING TIME AND POUNDS OF PRESSURE. Be sure to use appropriate altitude adjustments, i.e. pressure canning-15# pressure for weighted gauge; 12# pressure for dial gauge for altitude in Treasure Valley. Please list altitude for your canning entry. For boiling water altitude adjustments, see the chart on page 50 of the Culinary Department. PLEASE PUT LABELS ON SIDE OF JAR BEFORE BRINGING TO FAIR. Up-to-date standards as approved by University of Idaho Cooperative Extension System will be used in judging. If you have any questions regarding methods, call your county Extension Office.
