**How to enter – It is simple and easy and early!**

Bring in your entries with the entry form(s) to the Fairgrounds on **Wednesday, Aug. 19 from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. or on Thursday, Aug. 20 from 7:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.** Sorry, late entries cannot be accepted due to time constraints.

**Only entry day for Container Grown Plants (Divisions 16-20)** on Wednesday, Aug. 19, from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

All other divisions (**Designs: Divisions 1 – 7 and Horticulture: Divisions 8-15**) Wednesday or Thursday; for times see above. Entries will be taken in the North Expo Building.

If you want to enter early and reduce time spent in line on entry days, you have the following 2 options:

1.
  - a) Mail or deliver **ONLY** your entry form(s) to the Premium Office, 5610 Glenwood, Boise ID 83714 by **August 10.**
  - b) Bring your **Container Grown Plants** (Divisions 16-20) entries on **Aug. 19** from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.
  - c) Bring in all other entries (**Designs & Horticulture**) on **August 19** from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. or **Aug. 20** from 7:00 – 11:00 a.m.
- OR 2.
  - a) Enter online by **Aug. 10** at [www.idahofair.com](http://www.idahofair.com). Follow the link to Competitive Exhibits. The Western Idaho Fair will cover the \$2 convenience fee. There will be no charge to enter online unless a professional fee applies.
  - b) Bring your **Container Grown Plants** (Divisions 16-20) entries on **Aug. 19** from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.
  - c) Bring in all other entries (**Designs & Horticulture**) on **August 19** from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. or **Aug. 20** from 7:00 – 11:00 a.m.

Tips for Success:

- Do not bring heirloom, sentimental or other irreplaceable items as part of your entry. We cannot guarantee the item’s safe return.
- Select and cut multiples of your entry the day before and let them “drink” overnight. Bring and enter the best of the best!
- Make sure there is no foliage below the waterline prior to submitting your entry (this counts for judging!).
- Be early! Late entries cannot be accepted due to conflicting scheduling with judging.
- Complete your entry forms at home. Entry forms are available at The Western Idaho Fair Premium Office or on [www.idahofair.com](http://www.idahofair.com).

**ELIGIBILITY**

All divisions (except Division 7) in the Flower Department are open to amateur gardeners only. AMATEUR is anyone who does not derive their livelihood from the sale of flowers, plants, or floral designs. Each exhibitor is allowed one entry per class, unless otherwise noted.

Division 7 – PROFESSIONAL DESIGNS is open to floral professionals only. For this division, a PROFESSIONAL is anyone who works in the floral profession or otherwise derives a portion of their livelihood from the teaching of floral design or sale of flower arrangements. Each exhibitor is allowed one entry per class; an entry fee of **\$3.00** will be charged for each entry in the professional division.

Any plants or floral displays found to have insects will be refused. If any insects are found after registration, the exhibitor will be contacted and asked to remove the exhibit.

**ENTRY AND PARKING**

- **Location** – Department 13 – Flowers is located in the North Expo Building. The entry area is on the Northeast end of the building on the grassy area where tables are set up.
- **Parking** – During entry, parking is free. Vehicles can be parked for a few minutes in the area marked with **LOADING ZONE** signs to be quickly off-loaded on the outdoor tables provided. Afterwards, please move your vehicle to any of the available marked parking areas.
- **Entry Prep**
  - Place your horticulture entries on the provided tables outside. Then follow the steps below:
  - Before proceeding to the registration tables:
    1. Entry form: Complete your entry form if not previously done.
    2. If you do not have an exhibitor number, please proceed to the Exhibitor Number Table.

Once the above steps are completed, please proceed to the following steps:

1. If you registered online, please proceed to the **Online Registration Table**.
  2. If you did not register online but are registered with an exhibitor number and have your registration form filled out, please proceed to the Tag Clerk Table.
- (Entry clerks will take your registration paper and proceed to write tags for your entries). Please return to the outside tables and begin placing your entries into the provided vessels. All entries must be placed in the vessels provided. Your name will be called when our Entry Clerks are ready for you. Please be patient and wait outside till your name is called. If you are not ready when a clerk calls you, please let the clerk know, and your registration paper will be moved to the next in the pile. Please be completely ready.
  - Once called to registration the Entry clerks will check your entries and make sure each tag is matched with the appropriate entry and place the tag on your entry. Once tags are matched to entries, clerks will place them on the appropriate shelving.
  - If you are entering a floral design, you may place it in the correct location and set up. One of our registration clerks will assist you to the correct section.
  - Be sure to compare your prepared entry form with your final entry specimen(s).
  - Change anything needed on the entry form to make sure your entry(s) specimens and entry form match! **This is very important.** If you have questions, please ask any of the Flower Department clerks.

Example: You complete your entry form at home prior to entry day with the following items: a design, a dahlia, a delphinium, a rose, and a container grown plant. On your way to enter, the delphinium breaks, and you are not going to enter it. Simply line through this item on your entry form, obtain tags and enter your remaining items.

- All entries must be checked in by 11:00 a.m.

### JUDGING ALL ENTRIES

If an exhibit does not merit an Award, none will be given though it may be the only entry in that class. Decision of the Judges is final, and all entries must be considered by the Judges.

Exhibit area will be closed to the public for judging beginning at 2:00 p.m. Thursday, August 20.

Floral staff shall have the right to remove any unsightly design or horticulture. Precautions will be taken to ensure the safety of all exhibits and in no case will The Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendents be responsible for loss or injury of the same.

### PREMIUM PAY-OUT

Awards will be available at the Premium Office. Copy of Exhibitor Number Form should be presented for Premium pay-out. Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 26 through Aug. 30 from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release day, Monday, Aug. 31 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Sept. 1 through Sept. 11, awards will be given out from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend, including the Friday prior to Labor Day. **Awards not claimed by Sept. 11, 2026,** will be considered a donation and will revert back to The Western Idaho Fair general fund.

### RELEASE

Monday, Aug. 31 – 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. **In no case may exhibits be removed before 10:00 a.m. Monday, Aug. 31.** The Floral staff must check out all exhibits. Exhibits which are not claimed within one week after the close of the Fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the Manager of the Fair sees fit.

## DESIGNS

- All designs must be the work of the exhibitor but not necessarily grown by exhibitor unless otherwise specified in the class description.
- All designs entries must be less than 24” wide, except where otherwise specified. Designs should occupy a visually pleasing proportion of the allotted space.
- Artificial, treated or dyed fresh plant material (including flowers, fruits, vegetables, and foliage) **are not permitted** in designs.
- Fruits and vegetables that are cut open are not acceptable.
- No live animals are to be used in any class.
- Feathers may be used except for endangered or prohibited species.
- Accessories may be used in all design classes. If possible, put your name on the bottom of all your design pieces.
- Winning a Best of Division award in the Novice or Intermediate divisions does not automatically move you to the next level. Your design division level is based on the number of **blue ribbons** won for floral designs in previous fairs and flower shows.
- Fair will not be responsible for lost, damaged, broken, or stolen containers, accessories or any article included in or with a design entry.
- All entrants **must** include a note card listing the flower/plant material used in the design. Cards are available from the design placement clerk, if needed.  
Card should accompany the entry tag.

**HORTICULTURE**

- Horticulture must be grown by the exhibitor and must have been in their possession for a minimum of three months.
- Cut horticulture must be displayed in **clear plastic vases**. Every effort will be made to provide entrants with a Fair display vase for each entry; however, depending upon the number of entries this cannot be guaranteed.
- Preservative will be used by Fair Staff to keep containers clean and to preserve the cut flowers.
- **All entries must be placed in clear vessels provided. The Fair will not be responsible for lost or damaged containers. Please note: the container is not part of the judging criteria for Horticulture (Divisions 8-15).**
- Judges consider the stem, cleanliness and freshness of foliage and flowers. Foliage must not be polished with oil or other preparation.
- Foliage must be left on all cut specimens, but not be under water.
- Exhibitors should make sure to read this handbook for the correct number of stems needed in each class.
- Fresh flowers may be used to replace the original entry after several days, if needed.

- Container may not exceed 20” in diameter (unless otherwise noted) and cannot exceed 25 pounds including plant, container, and moist soil. Hanging plantings not to exceed 10 pounds. Use of an outer decorative pot is permitted on container grown plants.
- Plants must be free of harmful insects/pests or disease.
- Entries of Container Grown Plants (Division 17 – 21) will be taken **ONLY** on Wednesday, August 19, from 11:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Container Grown Plant entries will not be accepted on Thursday.
- Container grown plants exhibited any time in the last 3 years (2023-2025 Western Idaho Fairs) should not be entered this year.
- All entrants **must** include the following:
  1. A waterproof drain tray that is 1”-3” larger than the base of the container.
  2. A note card with watering instructions sufficient for the duration of the Fair printed on one side of the card. Cards are available from clerks at the PLACEMENT table, if needed.
  3. Plant identification (common name is sufficient) printed on the reverse side of the card.

**DIVISION 19 – CONTAINER GARDENS**

A miniature garden in small scale within a container not to exceed 15” x 15”. The garden must be self-contained and water-tight or include a water tray as noted above for all container grown plants. Should look like a full-size garden that has shrunk in size. Should include at least four plants and other components. Unless otherwise specified by a class, garden may include flowers, herbs, vegetables, dwarf shrubs and/or other ornamental plantings. Create a landscape or garden scene using accessories with dwarf or miniature plants and seedlings; all components should be in scale and proportion to each other.
