How to enter:

Bring in your entries with the entry form(s) to the Fairgrounds on **Monday, Aug. 17 or Tuesday, Aug. 18 from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** Entries will be taken in the South Expo Building.

If you want to enter early and reduce time spent in line on entry days, you have the following 2 options:

1. a) Mail or deliver **ONLY** your **entry form(s)** to the Premium Office, 5610 Glenwood, Boise ID 83714 by **August 10**.
b) Then bring your **entries** to the Fairgrounds on **Aug. 17 or Aug. 18** from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- OR 2.** a) Enter online by **Aug. 10** at www.idahofair.com. Follow the link to Competitive Exhibits. The Western Idaho Fair will cover the \$2 convenience fee. There will be no charge to enter online unless a professional fee applies.
b) Then bring your **entries** to the Fairgrounds on **Aug. 17 or Aug. 18** from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

ENTRIES: Entries will be received in the **South Wing** of the Exposition Building. Entries must be made on forms supplied by The Western Idaho Fair. Each exhibitor may enter only **ONE ARTICLE IN EACH CLASS**. No item can be entered for competition for more than one year. The individual or his authorized agent must enter projects. Any person, not an employee or officer of The Western Idaho Fair, is eligible to act as an agent. No articles sent by parcel post or express will be accepted. **“Professional” in this department refers to any person who has sold, taught, or is currently teaching their craft for any monetary gain.** An entry fee of \$3.00 will be charged for each project entered in the Professional Division only. **“Amateur” in this Department refers to those who do not sell their projects for any purpose or monetary gain.** If you entered an item in the professional division, you cannot enter items in the amateur category for that same division. There will be no entry fee charged in the Amateur Division.

All work entered in this Department must have been completed in the last two years. All articles entered shall be under the control of the Superintendent of this Department. If you have a **large entry** (one that will not fit through a single door) or **multiple entries**, please contact the Department Superintendent by August 7th to make arrangements.

1. **JUDGING:** Wednesday, Aug. 19 – 8:00 a.m. Department will be closed during judging. Where there is no competition, entry will be awarded first, second, third, or no premium, according to the merits of the article. Superintendents may adjust entry division and/or class for the best judging fit.

2. **PREMIUM PAY-OUT:** Awards will be available at the Premium Office. Copy of Exhibitor Number Form should be presented for Premium pay-out. Cash premiums will be paid to those entitled to awards on Aug. 26 through Aug. 30 from 12:00 noon to 8:00 p.m. and on Exhibit Release Day, Monday, Aug. 31 from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Starting Sept. 1 through Sept. 11, awards will be given out daily from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Office will be closed for Labor Day weekend, including the Friday prior to. **Awards not claimed by Sept. 11, 2026**, will be considered a donation, and will revert back to The Western Idaho Fair general fund.
3. **RELEASE:** Monday, Aug. 31-10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. **IN NO CASE MAY EXHIBITS BE REMOVED BEFORE 10:00 a.m. MONDAY, AUG. 31.** Exhibits which are not claimed within one week after the closing of the fair will be considered to have been abandoned and will be disposed of as the Manager of the Fair sees fit. **Exhibitors must present claim checks** corresponding to entry tags when claiming exhibits. Exhibits must not be removed without the Superintendent or assistants being present to check out entries.
4. **ADDITIONAL RULES:** Exhibitors are asked to review the General Rules of this Fair. **Department Rules supersede General Rules.**

5. **COMPUTER AIDED ENTRIES:** Some Divisions now include a class for items that have been designed using a computer (CAD files, Vector Art, Programming, etc.) and/or fabricated using computers, laser cutters/engravers, CNC and 3D Printers. The work must still be original and NOT from a purchased file (i.e. an SVG). The method must be disclosed during intake, and all work will be reviewed by a web search to ensure that it is original. If it is not original, it may be disqualified from judging and awards. Questions regarding this new category should be directed to the Superintendent via email at WIFHobbyCraft@gmail.com.
6. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of the exhibits. Still, the exhibitor assumes all responsibility for loss or theft, and in no case will the management of The Western Idaho Fair or the Superintendent be responsible for any loss or injury resulting therefrom.
7. We recommend that hot glue or duct tape not be used on entries. These products tend to release in warm temperatures.
8. **No power** will be provided for exhibits. **No water** will be allowed. Exhibits (i.e. fountains) must remain dry.
9. Space prohibits the display of signs, pictures, or business cards with exhibits. Small cards detailing the exhibit's technique may be placed by staff at superintendent's discretion.
10. To ensure the safety of the exhibits, patrons, and staff, **only Hobby Craft personnel** will be permitted in the Department during check-in, judging, set-up, and release day.
