

SMALL ANIMALS

Small Animal Market Sale Rules 4-H and FFA Information:

1. All market animals must be accounted for in a record book.
2. All pens must be weighed in on Thursday, August 20 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Market animals will be weighed-in by a Western Idaho Fair clerk. Each exhibitor is responsible for getting his or her market animals weighed-in at the appropriate times. Failure to do so will result in the market animals not being allowed to be sold. Animals must be dry when weighed and will be weighed only once.
3. Only 4-H'ers in Canyon and Ada Counties will be allowed to sell one (1) pen of three (3) rabbits or a pen of three (3) poultry.
4. Care of all market animals will be consistent with production practices and accepted standards.
5. The fair will provide feed for poultry, but exhibitor must provide their own for rabbits.

POULTRY

The sale for Poultry will be conducted in a silent auction format. An information and bidding table will be available for potential buyers to record their bid on the exhibitor's bid sheet. The bidding will begin on Sunday, August 23rd at 11:00 a.m. and conclude on Tuesday, August 25th, 6:00 p.m. Bidding will be done on a per pound basis. It will be up to the exhibitors to contact their successful buyers and to make the necessary arrangements.

1. Exhibitor will be responsible for solicitation of buyers, species supervisor and/or species supervisor assistant will deliver poultry to processor. Change of ownership is required.
2. A deduction will be made from the total amount of the sale of the total pen before checks are distributed. The amount deducted, not less than \$10, will be determined by the actual costs. This money will be used for expenses such as sale operation, collection of funds, and office fees. Funds will be payable to the Ada County 4-H Leaders Association.
3. Raise bid forms will not be accepted after the close of the auction and payment must accompany the form.
4. Payment must be received by Wednesday, August 26th at 12 pm by delivery of check or cash to Ada County Extension office, 5880 Glenwood St, Boise or by paying through PayPal to AdaCo4-HLeaders@outlook.com
5. Payment to the consigners will be made within two months after the sale is completed.
6. No insurance will be offered.
7. This is a terminal sale. The processor will be J Bar in New Plymouth.

RABBIT

Market Rabbit Pens will be sold through the Junior Market Livestock Sale on Tuesday August 25 at 6:00 p.m. For rules and regulations see pages 24 – 26.

This is a terminal sale, defined as a situation in which a formal change of ownership occurs. The Ada County Junior Market Livestock Sale Committee further requires all animals sold at the sale to be processed immediately following the event.

General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to the specific project.

Entries:

All Cat entries are due in the Premium Office by **July 31st** at 4:30 p.m. **\$50 Late Fee August 3-7**

All Ada County record books are due August 17-18. It is mandatory that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Sign up for interview times through ZSuite.

All cats will be brought in and taken home the day of the cat show.

Rules and Regulations:

1. All cats are to be crated and leashed at all times.
2. Cats are to be clean, free of diseases, well-groomed with front and back nails clipped for ease of handling.
3. **All cats must have a photo registration and current proof of vaccination submitted with their entry.**

Required vaccines are Distemper (FVRCP) 2-3 yrs., Rabies 1-3 years, & Leukemia 1-2 years.

A veterinarian will check the cats at check-in.

4. All cats are to be four months of age or older.

Showmanship:

All cats exhibited must be part of the member's project and recorded in the member's record book. Showmanship will be judged on the ability of the member to handle his/her cat skillfully and to control the cat at all times. If the handler cannot control the cat or if the cat becomes agitated or stressed, the cat will be removed from the ring. General health, cleanliness and grooming of the cat will be judged. Member's knowledge of basic cat anatomy, health, breed, and care will be judged. Cats must be shown in proper handling equipment which is a properly fitted harness and leash. Members should be neat and clean, and dressed appropriately for showmanship. The recommendation for proper 4-H showmanship attire is a white, long sleeve shirt/blouse, dark pants or skirt, and closed-toed shoes.

Costume:

Each participant will be allowed one exhibit per species from those exhibited at the fair. More than one animal may be used per exhibit from their own project. Cats need to be in harness. If they become unmanageable, they will have to return to their crate.



Exhibitors of cats must obtain a release from the Department Supervisor.

Awards will be made on merit as determined by the judge considering condition and showmanship skills of the exhibitor. All exhibitors will be judged by the Modified Danish System. Blue, Red or White flat ribbons will be awarded to each exhibitor. Blue flat ribbon exhibitors ranked 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each class will receive a Blue, Red, and White Rosette respectively. Rosettes will be awarded to the Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in both the Junior and Senior Divisions.

The Senior and Junior Champion Showman will be eligible to participate in the Small Animal Round Robin if there are 3 or more participants in these divisions. These Champions will be required to show a rabbit, poultry, dog, cat, cavy, and pygmy goat. Winner of the Small Animal Round Robin is determined by his or her ability to show all types of animals.

No person shall handle any cavy, other than their own, without permission of the division supervisor.

All cavy entries are due in the Premium Office by July 31st by 4:30 pm. \$50 Late Fee August 3-7

All Ada County 4-H record books are due August 17-18.

IT IS MANDATORY that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted.

All cavies must be permanently earmarked. Breed and variety of cavy, ear tag or tattoo number, birth date, and sex of the cavy should be indicated on entry form.

Rules and Regulations:

All cavies must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All cavies will be checked by a veterinarian at the Fairgrounds. Unsightly or unthrifty specimens are not acceptable and will be removed at the discretion of the Department Supervisor and/or the Junior Division Superintendent. Exhibitors need to provide their own cable ties to secure cage doors if desired. If questions arise, the decision of the Open Class Superintendent will prevail.

Showmanship:

All cavies exhibited must be part of the member's project and recorded in the member's record book. All cavies used

for showmanship must be exhibited at the fair and owned by the member. Cavy Showmanship will be according to the 4-H Cavy Showmanship standards. Information on these standards can be obtained from the UI Extension, Ada County in the ARBA Manual. Showmanship classes for cavies will be the same as for other livestock. Entries must be made on an entry blank and include birth date of member.

Judging:

Purebred classes will be judged by ARBA standards. A cavy that does not meet purebred restrictions will be entered into the appropriate PET class. Each breed will show separately. They will be judged first by variety then for Best of Breed. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their cavies to the judging table at the appropriate time. Ribbons will be awarded in all classes. No exhibitor may receive more than a combination of 20 premiums in the cavy division, but may exhibit more animals, if space allows. The division supervisor will interpret the rules and any items not covered by the rules. The decisions of the Department supervisors and/or Junior Division Supervisor will be final.

(No exhibitor shall be eligible for more than 2 premiums in any one class)

Herdsmanship:

All 4-H and FFA exhibitors will be responsible for the cleaning of their own cavy pens, as well as for feeding and watering their own animals. This is to be done daily by 10:00 a.m. Pen shavings are to be changed daily. We suggest you bring your own water bottles, but watering cups will be available. Feed will be provided for your animals. Each club is responsible for watching over their animals and keeping the floors tidy during each day the animals are exhibited. Each club will act

as host and hostesses in the Small Animal Building during the fair. All clubs are to sign up for shifts according to the number of animals involved at the fair.

Release of Animals:

4-H & FFA cavies will be released between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 25. All animals must be removed by 10:00 p.m. There will be no early releases. Ribbons and decorations may be removed starting at 8 p.m. Posters in the contest need to stay until end of the fair. If you cannot pick up your animal, please make arrangements with your 4-H or FFA leader. Any animal that is not picked up will be under the control of the Department Supervisor. A release will be granted when your area is cleaned. This includes the dumping of feed, water, cleaning and disinfecting of cups and trays, and sweep off the table. (No vehicles inside gate until after 10:00 p.m.)

DEPARTMENT J23

Dog

Supervisors: Tony & Theresa Houston



General Comments:

Each exhibitor, parent and leader participating in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the Junior Livestock – 4-H & FFA Rules and Information section pertaining to the specific project.

Exhibitors will keep their dogs under control at all times. OWNER ASSUMES FULL LIABILITY FOR ANY ACTION OF THEIR DOG(S). The judge will remove from competition any dog that cannot be controlled by its handler or acts aggressively towards persons or dogs. Any handler who interferes willfully with another competitor or dog; and/or any handler who uses excessive force or rough correction with his/her dog will be removed. Exclusion or expulsion is at the discretion of the judge, Dog Supervisor, or their designated person. If a dog or handler is expelled or excused by a judge, the reason shall be stated in the judge's report.

ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.

Entries:

All dogs must have a photo registration and current proof of vaccination, submitted to the Premium Office WITH the entry form. All dogs entering the fairgrounds and participating in the 4-H program must have proof of current vaccines for DHPP (Distemper, Hepatitis, Parainfluenza, Parvovirus), Rabies, and Bordatella (kennel cough), as documented by a licensed veterinarian. Current vaccines means that the time period for which the licensed veterinarian has validated the vaccines for, hasn't expired. Bordatella must be given within six months of the Fair. If for some reason your dog can not have a particular vaccine, it will be necessary to have a signed note from your veterinarian, stating why the vaccine cannot be given.

All dog entries are due in the Premium Office by July 31st by 4:30 p.m. \$50 Late Fee August 3-7

Ada County record books are due by August 17-18.

No late or incomplete entries or entries without current proof of vaccinations will be allowed to show. IT IS MANDATORY that all Ada County members be interviewed at the time the record book is submitted. Sign up for interview times through ZSuite.

All dogs will be checked by a Veterinarian at check-in. NO DOG WILL BE PERMITTED TO SHOW WITHOUT THE VET CHECK. No dogs 6 months old or under will be allowed to show. No bitches in season will be allowed to show.

Rules and Regulations:

1. All exhibitors' dogs must comply with the health requirements and other regulations under the Ada County Dog Project.
2. Dogs that are not registered on an entry form and have not submitted a photo registration with current vaccination record to the Ada County Extension or Premium Office will not be allowed on the show grounds. (Exception – If an exhibitor's dog is unable to participate due to illness, injury or being in season, a replacement dog may be used with a current signed health certificate. These exhibitors may not compete for rosettes or trophies.)
3. No dog will be permitted to show if they have been in an unprovoked dogfight 30 days prior to fair time.
4. Exhibitors are not permitted to show two dogs in one class. (An exhibitor can show more than one dog if they are registered in two different classes. i.e., showmanship and Rally obedience, pre-novice and open, etc.)
5. Dogs are to be crated or leashed at all times and are to be kept in exhibit area.
6. NO DOG IS TO BE LEFT UNATTENDED.
7. NO TREATS, TOYS or BAIT WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SHOW OR RALLY OBEDIENCE RING.
8. Champion and Reserve Champion showmanship winners will be eligible to compete in the Small Animal Round Robin. Anyone previously winning a Small Animal Super Round Robin at The Western Idaho Fair may not be eligible to participate. (see under Round Robin Showmanship)

Premiums (prize money): (No exhibitor shall be eligible for more than 2 premiums in any one class)

Showmanship – \$5.00 Blue, \$4.00 Red, or \$3.00 White flat ribbons will be grouped and awarded to each exhibitor.

Rally Obedience – Flat ribbons will be awarded to each exhibitor. Dogs will be placed in Blue, Red, and White award groups at the Judge's discretion. A minimum score of 70 is required for a Blue award, 20-69 for a Red award, 19 or less for a White award.

Premiums: \$4.00 Blue, \$3.00 Red, \$2.00 White

In addition to the prior, a 1st Blue Rosette, 2nd Red Rosette, 3rd White Rosette will be given respectively for the top 3 blue ribbon exhibitors in each Rally Obedience class. (No premiums for the Rosettes)

Cloverbuds – Participation Ribbon only, no premium will be paid.

A Rosette will be awarded to the Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in both Junior and Senior Divisions. A Rosette will be awarded to the Champion Rally Obedience Dog and Reserve Rally Obedience Dog.

Showmanship Classes:

Showmanship will be judged based on the criteria as outlined in the Canine Connection Dog 2 book page 31 and the Dog Resource Handbook (4-H 201R). In summary, the exhibitor will be judged on the ability of the member to handle his/her dog skillfully and to control the dog at all times while in the show ring. General health, cleanliness and grooming of the dog will be judged. Exhibitor's knowledge of basic dog anatomy, health, and care will be judged. Dogs must be shown in proper handling equipment; show collars and show leads. Members should be dressed appropriately for showmanship and be neat and clean. No open toe or heel shoes will be permitted. No treats, toys or bait will be allowed in the show ring.

Rally Obedience Classes:

Rally is a sport in which the dog and handler proceed in heel position through a course that has been designed by the rally judge, with several sequentially numbered instructional signs. Scores are based on accuracy and a clear sense of teamwork between the dog and handler both during and in between the numbered signs.

All Rally obedience dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or training collar. The collar is defined as either a flat collar or a slip collar of either chain or fabric with one ring at each end. All members competing in Rally obedience must use a leather or fabric lead. If you received a blue ribbon in your Rally obedience class at last year's fair, you must proceed to the next level of Rally obedience. (Exception: If an exhibitor has a new dog, they may be allowed to repeat levels at the discretion of the supervisor.) No treats, toys or bait will be allowed in the Rally obedience ring.

Costume:

Each participant will be allowed one exhibit per species from those exhibited at the fair from their own project. More than one animal may be used per exhibit from their own project. (Youth may sign up at shows or where it is posted.) Dogs can enter the fairgrounds starting at 5:00 pm. Exhibitors of dogs and cats must obtain a release from Department Supervisor.

Dog Judging Contest

The dog judging contest will allow exhibitors to test their knowledge about dogs and dog care. Topics include 4-H Dog showmanship, canine health, anatomy, training equipment, breeds, and groups. Use the curriculum guides as a resource. In addition, a study guide will be available for pick up on July 1 at the Extension Office or at the Premium Office. The dog judging contest will take place the day of the dog show between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. All Dog Judging Contest entries must be completed by 11:00 a.m.

Dog Showmanship

Rules and Regulations:

Poultry must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. Out-of-state poultry must meet Idaho import requirements. All out-of-state poultry must be accompanied by a Health Certificate from a veterinarian. All poultry are subject to inspection and testing at the Fairgrounds during check-in. Poultry should originate from flocks which are members of the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP). If tested, poultry are required to be negative for **Salmonella pullorum-typhoid**. Poultry may not enter the building until they have been tested and inspected.

NOTICE: The Western Idaho Fair will, in cooperation with the Idaho State Department of Agriculture, take all needed precautions to protect the Poultry Industry, Backyard Flocks, Exhibitors and General Public from the **Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza**.

PIGEONS AND DOVES

Pigeons and Doves must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. It is recommended that all pigeons be vaccinated for PMV and paratyphoid. All out-of-state pigeons must be accompanied by a Health Certificate from a veterinarian. All pigeons and doves are subject to inspection at the Fairgrounds.

All birds' health will be checked before entering the building. Birds suffering from disease or external parasites at check in will be refused entry by the Supervisor or Assistant Supervisor.

Birds will not be accepted without a numbered leg band. The number must be listed on the entry form. All pigeons must be banded with a seamless band of reputable banding organizations. If split bands are used, pigeons will be classed as old birds.

Newly purchased birds or eggs may not be shown. Birds must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor for at least 90 days, must be a 4-H project and must be in the exhibitor's record book.

Breed, variety, division, class, band number, birth date and sex of the birds entered in the poultry division must



be included on the fair entry form. Only birds listed on the fair entry form will be allowed in the building. Any entry form not filled out correctly and signed will be sent back.

No person other than the owner shall handle any of the poultry exhibited without permission of the Supervisor.

Exhibitors need to provide their own cable ties to secure cage doors if desired. If questions arise, the decision of the Supervisor and/or Open Class Superintendent will prevail.

EGG DROP 2026

Saturday, August 22 5:00 p.m. Small Animal Building

Open to anyone 18 and under at the time of the contest.

You do not have to be a 4-H or FFA member to participate, this contest is open to the general public.

No pre-registration necessary but Participants are required to acquire their own materials and build their egg drop container prior to arrival to the competition. Large Grade A raw eggs and a small plastic bag for each egg will be supplied at the competition. All containers will be examined by judges before they are dropped.

Objective: Design and construct a container which will prevent a raw egg from breaking when dropped from a height. Multiple drops may be required if there is a tie. The egg must be able to be examined after each drop.

Container Judging Criteria:

- How well the egg survives: no cracking, slight cracking with no leaks, fully cracked.
 - How many times the egg is dropped before cracking.
- In case of a tie, the following will be considered:
- The size and weight of the design (preference of smaller and lighter).
 - Ease of examining egg after impact.
 - Creativity and engineering craftsmanship.
 - Durability of the container.
 - Incorporation of the “Cowboy Boots & Fair Roots” theme
 - Judges’ discretion. Judges’ decision is final.

Rules:

- Containers must be small enough to fit inside a 12x12x12 inch box (to quickly verify size requirements).
- Containers can weigh no more than 5 lbs.
- No external strings, parachutes, etc. can be attached to container.
- Containers must not be dangerous to spectators while falling or after impact.
- Containers must not damage the landing surface.
- Containers must not make a mess that cannot be quickly cleaned up after impact.
- No propulsion system will be allowed.

Prohibited Materials:

- Liquid or gel
- Styrofoam
- Packing peanuts

- A large quantity of metal (such as a steel frame)
- Confetti

Allowed materials (no all inclusive):

Wood, Glue, Tape, Paper Products, Cardboard, Straws, Rubber Bands, Rubber, Plastics, String, Bubble wrap, Yarn, etc.

- Humpty Dumpty Award – the container that breaks in the most spectacular fashion.
- Eggelicious – egg drop entry that is the most aesthetically pleasing to the judges.

Rules & Regulations:

All rabbits must be sound, in good health, and free of communicable diseases. All rabbits will be inspected by the veterinarian before being checked in. All rabbits must be owned by the exhibitor for 90 days (May 22, 2026) except fryer pens and junior animals born from does owned by the exhibitor prior to this date. All rabbits must be a 4-H or FFA project and be in the exhibitor's 4-H or FFA record book. Unsightly or unthrifty animals are not acceptable and will be removed at the discretion of the Department Supervisors and/or the Junior Division Superintendent. Exhibitors may secure cages with cable ties, but **no padlocks** may be used. If questions arise, the decision of the 4-H/FFA Supervisors will prevail.

Due to space restrictions all exhibitors are limited to **no more than 10 coops**. Young rabbits who have not reached sexual maturity may share a coop at the discretion of the exhibitor. No intact rabbits 3 months old or older may share a coop.

Any rabbits with signs of illness will be required to leave the fairgrounds, no exceptions.

No rabbits allowed outside of the Small Animal Building without the approval of the Supervisor.

No rabbits under 8 weeks of age will be admitted. No rabbits who are nursing will be admitted.

All rabbits must have a legible identification tattoo in the left ear consisting of numbers or letters only (NO SYMBOLS). Exhibitors are encouraged to obtain this tattoo prior to check-in day. Ear tattooing will be available at check-in for a fee.

Each breed and each breed variety or group is also judged separately. The best of breed is chosen from all varieties within that breed. Classes will be judged by ARBA standards. Breeds not recognized by ARBA will be allowed in their own class if exhibitor provides a working standard of perfection. Only ARBA recognized breeds can compete for Best in Show. Purebred rabbits with a disqualification at check-in are encouraged to enter the pet class, but must do so prior to judging. Animals disqualified from breed classes are not eligible for a blue award. Any rabbit that does not fit the standard of perfection for its breed should be entered into the appropriate crossbred/pet class. The division supervisor will interpret the rules and any items not covered by the rules. Each rabbit can only be entered in one quality class.

Fryers, Roasters, Stewers:

Single Fryers, Roasters, Stewers are a separate class, that are shown in the meat show. They will NOT be sold in the livestock auction. These animals should also be shown in their respective breed quality classes. Single Fryers, Roasters, and Stewers will be judged on meat type, condition, and fur per ARBA standard.

Market Rabbit Pens

Fryer Pens will consist of 3 rabbits and be judged based on ARBA rules for meat type, uniformity, condition, and fur qualities. See Class information for weight and age limitations. Exhibitor must own the breeding doe and raise the kits from birth. All market rabbits must be a commercial breed and the same variety (pg. 38 in Standard of Perfection).

Market rabbits will be sold during the live auction on Tuesday, August 25 at 6:00 p.m. For more information see page 25. Rabbits that are disqualified from show are not eligible for prize or to be sold.

Standard for Meat Pens:

The four factors, in order of their importance, (1) Meat type, (2) Condition, (3) Uniformity, and (4) Fur.

Meat pens shall consist of three rabbits, all of the same breed and variety. Age Limit 12 weeks. Minimum weight 3 ½ pounds each. Maximum weight 6 pounds each. All rabbits must be weighed in the presence of the Supervisor.

Point Schedule for judging meat pens:

Meat type: 40 points

Condition of flesh: 30 points

Uniformity of body and weight: 20 points

Fur: 10 Points

Total: 100 points

Emerging Risk Notice: No **out-of-state** rabbits or rabbits

that have been **out-of-state** in the past **30** days are allowed on The Western Idaho Fair grounds to prevent outbreaks of **Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV2)**. RHDV2 is highly contagious and is transmitted between rabbits through contact with other infected rabbits, contaminated food, water, or materials. People can also inadvertently spread the virus to new areas, for instance on their footwear.

Herdsmanship:

Each club should have its name clearly displayed along with the club or chapter’s educational exhibit and/or individual member’s exhibit. All club and chapter members will act as hosts and hostesses in the Small Animal Building during the fair. Time slots not volunteered for will be assigned to clubs or chapters according to the number of animals displayed at the fair.

Small Animal Building Hours: 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Release of Animals:

4-H & FFA rabbits will be released between the hours of 9:00 and 10:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 25. There will be no early releases. If you cannot pick your animal up, make arrangements with your 4-H leader or FFA Advisor. Any animals not picked up will be under the control of the Department Supervisor. Feed needs to be dumped from the feeders, water troughs emptied, and the cement floor cleaned before release forms will be given. Ribbons and decorations may be removed starting at 8:00 p.m., however the animals are not to be released till 9:00 p.m. For Cloverbuds and younger

children attending school the next day, parents may clean cage area and have animals released to them. (No vehicles inside gate until after 10:00 p.m.)
